



WHEREAS, the health of our community's people is the foundation for a caring and productive society, and our future rests with our ability to adequately treat, and ultimately find cures for, individuals who are affected with a variety of illnesses including pulmonary hypertension;

WHEREAS, pulmonary hypertension (PH) is a chronic, life-threatening lung disease marked by elevated blood pressure in the lungs;

WHEREAS, without treatments, PH patients live an average of 2.8 years past diagnosis;

WHEREAS, multiple treatments are available for PH, but it takes patients an average of nearly 3 years to be accurately diagnosed. This delay in diagnosis has not changed in the past twenty years;

WHEREAS, PH patients who are diagnosed earlier have a longer life-expectancy;

WHEREAS, education can help with early diagnosis and funding for research can help find a cure;

WHEREAS, the Pulmonary Hypertension Association is a nonprofit organization that seeks ways to prevent and cure pulmonary hypertension, and to provide hope for the PH community through support, education, advocacy and awareness;
