

## **PROCLAMATION**

- WHEREAS, on February 22, 1991, Tony "Captain Tony" Tarracino, Mayor of the City of Key West declared that day "Mohawk Day" and welcomed the US Coast Guard Cutter MOHAWK to Key West, Florida for the first time; and
- WHEREAS, the crew of the Mohawk has provided a significant and valued addition to our schools, churches, civic organizations, economy, and community atlarge for many years; and
- WHEREAS, the USCGC Mohawk is the final of thirteen 270-foot medium-endurance cutters built for the Coast Guard and is the namesake of the USS MOHAWK that launched 14 attacks against Nazi submarines during World War II; and
- WHEREAS, On February 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2022, the Mohawk crew will donate their time and effort to remove litter from Mallory Square, Duval Street, Palm Avenue, and various other areas throughout the day; and
- WHEREAS, Mohawk is coordinating with the city's Adopt-a-Spot program to formally adopt a location in Key West that the crew will take care of long-term;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Teri Johnston, Mayor of the City of Key West along with the Key West City Commission proclaim February 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2022, as
