- WHEREAS, the purpose of this proclamation is to educate the public about the many reasons people are hungry and homeless including the shortage of affordable housing in Key West for very low income residents; and to encourage support for homeless assistance service providers as well as community service opportunities for students and school service organizations; and
- WHEREAS, there are many dedicated and effective organizations, including dozens of not-forprofit and public agency members of the Monroe County Homeless Services Continuum-of-Care that are committed to sheltering and providing supportive services as well as meals and food supplies to people experiencing hunger and homelessness; and
- WHEREAS, the City Commission recognizes that hunger and homelessness continues to be a serious problem for many individuals and families in Key West and the Florida Keys; and
- WHEREAS, the intent of National Hunger and Homelessness Awareness Week is consistent with the activities of the Monroe County Homeless Services Continuum-of-Care.

NOW, THEREFORE, I Craig Cates, Mayor of the City of Key West and Jimmy Weekley, District 1 City Commissioner, do hereby proclaim November 15-23, 2014 as

National Hunger and Homelessness Awareness Week
