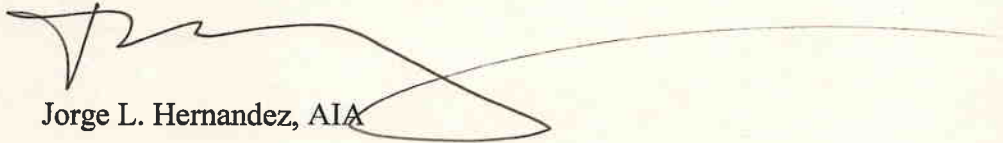

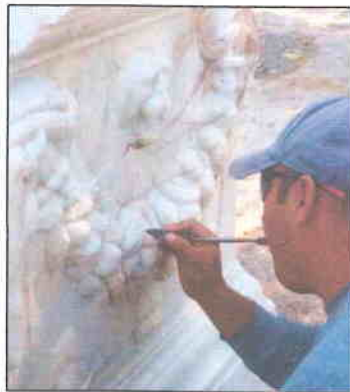

Vizcaya Museum & Gardens located in Miami Florida contains the largest collection of Italian outdoor sculpture in the United States. The breadth of the collection is vast and ranges from marble Roman antiquities to limestone Renaissance figures to nineteenth-century lead garden elements. The collection has suffered the ravages of tropical storms and hurricanes over the past 100 years. Grants from the Tiffany & Company Foundation, the federal government's Save America's Treasures program, and funds from Miami-Dade County are supporting the multi-year outdoor sculpture conservation project. Conservation Solutions, Inc. (CSI) was selected for the contract and the first phase of work began in December 2009 to restore the sculptures and fountains located in the Fountain Garden.

This significant scope includes a wide range of highly meticulous masonry conservation services, including: cleaning; fabricating/installing new element footings (concrete) and bases (stone) and resetting the sculptures; reversing previous interventions involving embedded ferrous metals and pinning fragments with stainless steel threaded rod; crack injection; joint pointing; patching and sculpting both flat and highly decorative losses; and providing supportive armature for severely damaged or at-risk objects at this hurricane-prone site. Masonry materials treated include lime- stone, marble, travertine, sandstone, and historic concrete. Challenges also included scheduling, staging, and phasing the treatment of this expansive collection in a timely and efficient way with minimal impact to visitors and staff.

CSI collaborated with skilled masons from Standard Restoration and Waterproofing, Inc., in the successful completion of these treatments.

The Mizner Memorial Fountain, designed by American architect Addison Mizner and constructed in 1929, is located in Memorial Fountain Park in Palm Beach, Florida. The fountain consists of a main circular basin or pool approximately sixteen-feet in diameter. The main basin contains a set of multi-tiered bowls and stems of diminishing size. The large lower bowl is held up by a thick central stem and four hippocamps or mythological sea-horses. The design is based on the *Fontana dei Cavalli Marini* in the Borghese Gardens in Rome.

All parts of the fountain are constructed of a cast stone that is designed to imitate the color and texture of the local coral limestone. The cast stone is reinforced with rebar. Constant exposure to running water and corrosion of rebar had caused significant deterioration of the cast stone fountain, resulting in loss, cracking, and erosion of details.

In 2012, Conservation Solutions, Inc. (CSI) was contracted to assess the fountain, perform analysis of the cast stone, and prepare treatment recommendations for its restoration. CSI began by inspecting the fountain and analyzing original drawings to determine how the fountain was constructed and how sculptural elements had appeared prior to significant deterioration. Petrographic and chemical analysis were performed on cast stone samples to determine the composition and level of carbonation, if any. Analysis determined that high levels of carbonation in the cement paste had caused a loss of alkalization, contributing to deterioration of embedded rebar. CSI developed a treatment plan that included improved waterproofing of the basin, replication of highly deteriorated cast stone elements (guided by original drawings), and repair of salvageable cast stone elements. Several feasible options were presented to ensure the long-term preservation of the existing reinforced cast stone by protecting rebar from further corrosion.

Conservation Solutions, Inc. (CSI) treated the 1920 cast stone and concrete monument in 2009. Work was based on our assessment and the architect's and engineer's recommendations. The logistics of working on the unoccupied island were a major challenge of the project. Each day, a team of skilled craftsmen were ferried to and from the isolated island in Biscayne Bay from Miami Beach to work. All water, materials, and equipment had to be loaded at the site by barge and crane.

The entire monument was first cleaned by a combination of low pressure water-jetting. Loose and flaking paint and previous repair parges were removed from the obelisk to expose sound original surfaces. Areas were sounded and where necessary, damaged concrete was cut back to a sound surface and to expose deteriorated rebar. The rebar was blast-cleaned to bright metal and treated with a corrosion inhibitor and a protective coating. All losses and spalls were then rebuilt using restoration mortars. Cracks were injected with a compatible grout. The entire structure was then coated with a potassium silicate paint matching the historic color.

Work on the figures was more extensive. Each had suffered damages from vandalism and corrosion of the internal reinforcing. Extensive surface erosion had deteriorated the legibility of the forms. Inexpert repairs over the monument's 80 year life had further masked the modeling. Each was cleaned using the JOS/QuintekMicroabra-sive System and was then treated with a biocide. Loose fragments of the parge were then carefully chipped away to reveal the substrate. Replacements for missing and damaged arms, hands and feet were modeled and cast in restoration mortar. Each figure was then coated using similar methods and materials to the obelisk.

The Flagler Memorial Monument is sited on a man-made island in Biscayne Bay, between Miami Beach and Miami. Built in 1920-21 by Carl Fisher, the developer of Miami Beach, it memorializes Henry Flagler who turned his profits as founding partner of Standard Oil into developing railroads and property on the east coast of Florida, starting in Saint Augustine and ending with the construction of the Overseas Railroad to Key West. The monument consists of a 96' tall cast concrete obelisk with four cast stone allegorical figures around the base depicting *Education*, *Industry*, *Prosperity*, and *Pioneer*.

The isolated island site has left the monument vulnerable to assaults from vandalism in addition to the effects of exposure to wind, floods, hurricanes and the occasional lightning strike. Salts and carbonation of the concrete led to deterioration of the embedded rebar and inappropriate repairs from a 1940 campaign had led to losses of arms and hands on the sculptures. There was also graffiti, scraffiti, losses, biological growths, and failed coatings on most surfaces.

In 2006, Conservation Solutions, Inc. (CSI) was contracted to assess the monument, evaluate test results and engineering reports, and prepare treatment recommendations for its restoration. CSI conservators inspected the monument, reviewed the material developed by the other team members and available historical documentation, and developed a series of treatment options, ranging from minimal to optimal and long term, for the city which intends to conserve the monument.

Coral Gables, "The City Beautiful" was planned and developed during Miami's land boom in the 1920's and immediately became an icon of the good life that Florida promised. The Coral Gables Fire and Police Station was built to a design by Phineas Paist, one of the original architects of the town, in 1936. The unique solid ashlar coral stone structure is embellished with exterior busts and brackets in cast stone and interior Cuban Tile elements (decorative pre-cast concrete panels). This National Historic Landmark is being restored and updated to serve as the Coral Gables Museum.

The conversion represents a challenge to the project designers. The coral stone and interior Cuban tiles have deteriorated noticeably due to moisture infiltration. The porous nature of the stone makes the museum's goal of providing climate controlled exhibition grade spaces particularly challenging. The stone's unusual texture, along with its predilection for staying moist, also made the exterior extremely hospitable the accumulation of soiling, biological and substantial vegetative growth.

Conservation Solutions, Inc. (CSI) was contracted to help restore the masonry structure. All exterior surfaces were cleaned to remove soiling, biota and vegetation. Ferrous and other inappropriate anchors were removed and patched. Losses to cast stone units were rebuilt and sculpted to match the existing. Following extensive development and refinement, a lime-based parge was applied to all exterior stone surfaces to limit water infiltration through the porous ashlar units. The fills were designed to complement the specific physical characteristics of the stone, while remaining sufficiently recessed so that the unique coral texture remained legible. Low-toxicity and natural products were emphasized in this LEED-certified project.
