- WHEREAS, Martin Luther King, Jr. was born in Atlanta, Georgia on January 15, 1929 and spent his life fighting for equality and civil rights for all Americans; and
- WHEREAS, Rev. Dr. King was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize in 1964 for his work in the civil rights movement; and
- WHEREAS, Martin Luther King, Jr. was assassinated in Memphis, Tennessee on April 4, 1968 for his dedication to this cause; and
- WHEREAS, by Congressional order his birthday is celebrated throughout the United States as a National holiday, that day designated to be the third Monday in January of each year; and
- WHEREAS, Martin Luther King Jr. Birthday was first celebrated on January 20<sup>th</sup>, 1986. Twenty three years later, our nation inaugurated its first African American President, Barack Obama, who has called on all Americans to participate in our nation's recovery and renewal by serving in our communities on this day in remembrance of Dr. King and the Dream. In 2012, he was re-elected handily despite the odds because of Dr. King's dream; and
