

2. THE MINIMUM PLANTING AREA FOR NEWLY PLANTED STREET TREES SHALL BE A MIN. ROOTZONE VOLUME OF 700 CUBIC FEET, 550 CUBIC FEET FOR TREES THAT SHARE A ROOTZONE. ALL OTHER SHADE TREES SHALL BE PROVIDED WITH A MIN. ROOTZONE OF 420 CUBIC FEET.






LANDSCAPE PLAN





An application was received for the removal and transplanting of trees for the creation of the Vietnam Memorial at Bayview Park. The development of the project will result in the removal of (6) Royal Poinicana trees, (1) Yellow Poinciana tree, (2) Washingtonian Palms, (1) Coconut Palm, and (1) Date Palm and the transplanting of (3) Date Palms. A site inspection was done on December 23, 2014. Photos were also taken in February 2014.







NOTE: The Royal Poinciana trees in this area are all stressed. Tidal salt water from the Jose Marti pond area comes up through the drainage grates. Salt water has been observed at the base of Royal Poinciana trees #1 and #15. Royal Poinciana trees do not like salt water in their roots for periods of time nor lots of direct salt spray.

Plants in this area of Bayview Park should be salt tolerant due to excess amounts of direct salt spray and salt water intrusion into the root systems.



Approval of the landscape plan is a Final Landscape Plan approval with Tree Removal. In consulting with the Interim Planning Director, the only other approval needed for this project is HARC and City Commission review and approval.

The group that is responsible for building the Vietnam Living Memorial is an approved 501C.3 organization.



I will need a copy of the 501C 3 paperwork before the meeting. With this information, the group can request a reduction in the required tree replacements. In other words, they may be able to request approval of the landscape plan as is without additional requirements (look at Sec 110-327 (7) (b) ii in the Key West City of Code of ordinances).

I have written a draft of my staff report and right now I am showing replacement requirements of 62.5" and 4-native palms (this is for the removal of 6-Royal Poinciana's, 1-Yellow Poinciana and 4-palms). I am estimating that the landscape plan incorporates approximately 40 " of native trees and many palms so you can see we are short on the inches.

WHEREAS, the Key West Garden Club, in cooperation with the National Garden Club, placed a Blue Star Memorial marker along US 1, in Bayview Park in 1949, as a living tribute to the men and women of the Nation's Armed Forces; and

WHEREAS, Blue Star Markers are traditionally placed along highways, and the marker was moved to a more prominent location in the median of US 1, at the entrance to Key West, and later to a scenic, landscaped location along the side of the highway, with on-going maintenance performed by members of the Key West Garden Club; and

WHEREAS, the recent re-construction of US 1/Roosevelt Blvd. has rendered the location of the marker less visible, and members of the Garden Club have requested that the marker be installed again at Bayview Park, alongside US 1, in or near the area of the park now designated as a Veterans Memorial; and

WHEREAS, the City Commission finds that installation of the Blue Star Memorial, in a highly visible location at Bayview Park, is a suitable way to recognize the efforts and dedication of military veterans, those who continue to serve, and those who will serve in the future;

Dear Commissioner Weekley:

On behalf of The Key West Garden Club, we are asking your help in returning the Blue Star Memorial marker to its original position along Truman Ave. (US 1) in Bayview Park.

In 1947 the Florida State Legislature designated US 1 as a Blue Star Memorial Highway to honor World War II veterans and in 1951 they expanded it to include all men and women, who had served, were serving or would serve in the United States armed forces.

The Key West marker is historically significant because it is Florida's first Blue Star Memorial sponsored by the Florida Federation of Garden Clubs. Dedication of the marker took place on May 30, 1949 in Bayview Park and the Key West Garden Club has refurbished and maintained the marker ever since.

Although initially placed in Bayview Park, the marker was moved 20 years ago to the entrance of Key West in the median on US 1. For safety purposes it was later moved across the road near Cow Key Channel Bridge. Because of the many trees planted in this area the marker has become virtually invisible to passers-by. Not only is it difficult to see, it is very hard for Garden Club members to get to and maintain properly.

The Garden Club believes that the appropriate place for the Blue Star Memorial is with the other War Memorials in Bayview and that a move back to its original location will provide important access for visitors to the City as well as our members.

Is there additional documentation or information you need from the Key West Garden Club to bring this request forward?
