

DIVISION 2. - TOURS

Sec. 70-521. - Bus tours restricted in historic district.

- (a) Definitions. The following words, terms and phrases when used in this section shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this subsection:

Bus tour means a sightseeing tour or an excursion to or through places of tourist interest in Key West.

Historic district means all areas of the city with an historic zoning designation.

- (b) No person or firm shall operate a bus tour using a bus in excess of 31 feet in length on the streets of the historic district.
- (c) A bus in excess of 31 feet taking passengers directly to a specific destination may use the streets of the city and its historic district, but only those streets designated by the city manager. (A map of those streets is attached to and made a part of Ordinance No. 01-17.) If the origination of a 31-foot bus to be used for a bus tour is Key West or Monroe County, notwithstanding the origination of its passengers, then the operator must obtain a franchise from the city in order to operate a bus tour on the public right-of-way.

Sec. 70-522. - Parking restricted.

On any street or other public right-of-way of the city, it shall be unlawful for any person to park, allow to be parked or allow to remain standing or stationary (other than in the normal course of traffic flow) any bus, whether occupied or not, attended or unattended, except for the purpose of loading or unloading passengers or property at loading zones designated by the city manager. All buses must park on private property (with the permission of the property owner) or at locations designated for such purpose by the city manager.

Sec. 70-523. - Enforcement of sections 70-521 and 70-522.

Violations of sections 70-521 and 70-522 may be enforced by the issuance of a parking ticket or by a citation pursuant to section 1-15 of this Code, as applicable.
