A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF KEY WEST, FLORIDA, OPPOSING FLORIDA HOUSE BILL 583 AND FLORIDA SENATE BILL 1464, WHICH, IF PASSED, WOULD PROVIDE THAT PUBLIC RESTROOMS ARE RESTRICTED TO PERSONS OF THE SEX WHICH FACILITY THE IS DESIGNATED, EFFECTIVELY REQUIRING CITIZENS, INCLUDING TRANSGENDER CITIZENS, TO BE ABLE TO PROVIDE DOCUMENTATION OF THEIR BIOLOGICAL GENDER, OR 'PAPERS TO PEE," IN ORDER TO GO ABOUT THEIR DAILY LIVES; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE

WHEREAS, City staff has received notice that the Florida Legislature is considering HB 583 and SB 1464, which would require that the use of single-sex public restroom facilities be restricted to persons of the sex for which the facility is designated; and

WHEREAS, the City Commission is concerned that this legislation will leave schools and business open to costly and unnecessary litigation and would encourage them to police restrooms to ensure that every person has the appropriate 'papers to pee' before entering; and

WHEREAS, the City Commission finds that this proposed legislation intentionally undermines human rights protections that already exists for a majority of Floridians and seeks to solve a problem that does not exist; and

WHEREAS, legislation which is exclusionary specifically toward transgendered individuals, is not only wrong, but it threatens Florida's tourism-based economy; and

WHEREAS, there are adequate state laws regarding criminal
behaviors which take place inside public facilities, and additional
legislation is not necessary;
NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE
CITY OF KEY WEST, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:
Section 1: That the Key West City Commission strongly opposes
proposed HB 583 and SB 1464 and urges its legislators to oppose
such measures.
Section 2: That the City Clerk is hereby authorized to
transmit a certified copy of this Resolution to Representative
Raschein, Senator Bullard, and Governor Rick Scott and members of
the House and Senate leadership.
Section 3: That this Resolution shall go into effect
immediately upon its passage and adoption and authentication by the
signature of the presiding officer and the Clerk of the Commission.
