the Florida Department of Health in Monroe County has finalized a document called the Community Health Improvement Plan or "CHIP" which serves as a free reference guide for Monroe County residents and visitors on the health status of Monroe County micro-communities, for which there are 19 micro-communities from Key West to Key Largo; and

WHEREAS,

based on the U.S. Census tract boundaries, a micro-community is a small group of neighborhoods in the Florida Keys that share a common environment and, therefore, people who share the same environment may share common health conditions; and

WHEREAS,

the Florida Department of Health in Monroe County is the first county health department in Florida to create a premier publication that features age-adjusted death rate data for various diseases and conditions at the micro-community level; and

WHEREAS,

the Florida Department of Health in Monroe County encourages residents and visitors to use the CHIP as a tool to learn about the health status and needs of their micro-community as health is a valuable asset and vital to the improvement in the quality of life of the residents and visitors of Monroe County.
