



**Commendation  
for  
Green Commute Challengers  
and  
U.S. Coast Guard – Sector Key West**

During the week of March 23<sup>rd</sup> to March 29<sup>th</sup>, fifteen of the largest employers within the City of Key West were challenged by City Manager Jim Scholl to a Green Commuting Challenge, whereby employees can earn points for how they commuted to work. The highlights for the eight employers that rose to the challenge are:

- **Florida Keys Mosquito Control:** Our smallest employer, they came in 2<sup>nd</sup> place for their Tier; Tied for 2<sup>nd</sup> highest participation rates overall;
- **Lower Keys Medical Center:** Highest # of bikers; Highest % of 4-stroke vs. 2-stroke scooters;
- **Spottswood Management:** Highest # of walkers; Highest percentage & # of bussers;
- **Southernmost Hotel Collection:** Best carpool group; Highest # of bikers; 2 daily bussers;
- **First State Bank:** Highest percentage walkers; Highest % of Fuel Efficient Cars;
- **Florida Department of Health:** 1<sup>st</sup> place in employers <100 employees; Highest percentage of carpoolers; Highest percentage of overall participation.
- **City of Key West:** 1<sup>st</sup> place in employers >251 employees; the only two skateboarders and 197 miles of bike miles from just three employees;

and, the best performing employer of all:

**U.S. Coast Guard – Sector Key West:** Grand Prize winner, with the highest average commute score; 1<sup>st</sup> place in employers with 101-250 employees; highest percentage of bikers;
