WHEREAS, the Schooner Western Union was submitted to the National Register of Historic Places on May 16, 1984; and

WHEREAS, in Resolution No. 97-301, the City of Key West proclaimed the Schooner Western Union the Official Flagship of the City of Key West, and in the Florida State House Rotunda it is listed as the State Flagship of Florida; and

WHEREAS, the Schooner Western Union remains an integral piece of the history of Key West and the Historic Seaport at Key West Bight; and

WHEREAS, the Schooner Western Union requires substantial restoration and upgrades to remain seaworthy, and continue its role as a unique example of living history to educate residents and visitors about the significant role of Key West, and the State of Florida, within maritime history; and

WHEREAS, the Schooner Western Union Preservation Society (SWUPS), a 501(c)3 non-profit organization, is charged with preserving the Schooner Western Union, and has identified a State Historic Preservation grant funding program, which requires a funding match of up to \$250,000.00, towards a restoration project with a total value of up to \$750,000.00; and

WHEREAS, at its meeting of June 10, 2015, the Key West Bight Management District Board considered SWUPS request for a funding Letter of Commitment from the City, in support of their grant application; and

WHEREAS, a Letter of Commitment would enable SWUPS to meet the grant deadline of June 30, 2015 and help to preserve the Schooner Western Union for generations to come; and

WHEREAS, there are sufficient funds in the Key West Bight unrestricted reserves to account for this cost.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CAROLINE STREET CORRIDOR AND BAHAMA VILLAGE COMMUNITY REDEVELOPMENT AGENCY, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: That a Letter of Commitment, for the amount of up to \$250,000.00, to the Schooner Western Union Preservation Society and Museum is hereby authorized.

Section 2: That any financial commitment set forth in the Letter of Commitment authorized herein on behalf of the Key West Historic Seaport/City of Key West, is contingent upon the award of a State of Florida Historic Preservation Grant for restoration of the Schooner Western Union. City/CRA funds will be used specifically to match the State grant funds in a 50% ratio, up to a total of \$250,000.00.

Section 3: That SWUPS shall agree to execute an agreement to guarantee that the vessel will remain at the Key West Historic Seaport.

Section 4: That no funds shall be expended as a result of this Letter of Commitment without further Resolution of the City Commission.

Section 5: That necessary budget transfers are authorized consistent with this resolution.

Section 6: That the City Manager is authorized to execute a Letter of Commitment for the amount of up to \$250,000.00, as required for grant application purposes for the State of Florida Historic Preservation Grant documents, upon the advice and consent of the City Attorney.

Section 7: That this Resolution shall go into effect immediately upon its passage and adoption and authentication by the signature of the presiding officer and the Clerk of the Agency.

## Senate Bill No. 326

An act relating to state symbols; creating s. 15.0465, F.S.; designating the schooner Western Union as the official state flagship; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Section 15.0465, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

15.0465 Official state flagship.—The schooner Western Union, a 130-foot historic sailing vessel of the tall ship class, built in Key West and first launched in 1939, is designated the official state flagship.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2012.



The undersigned resides at 1312 Olivia Street, Key West, Florida. I am active in community affairs and have served on the boards of several not-for profit corporations, including the Florida Keys Assisted Care Coalition and Hometown PAC.

The Western Union, official flagship of the City of Key West and the State of Florida, has for seventy-five years, been a vital part of Key West's history. Its continuing use taking students, locals and tourists on inspiring and educational sailings is a testament to our State's rich maritime history. Locals receive a 50% discount on tickets.

It is the last tall ship built in Monroe County and was constructed and launched off Simonton Beach in Key West in 1939. In 2007, the schooner was donated to the all-volunteer Schooner Western Union Preservation Society (SWUPS) debt free so that contributions from the public would be charitable and used to maintain her. The reality is that old wooden ships always require preservation to remain a part of our living history.

Now, the Schooner Western Union requires financial assistance in order to meet the Coast Guard requirements for passenger ships before she can sail again. I have been advised that the SWUPS Board has submitted an application to the FL DOS, Historic Preservation Grant Program.

- 2 - June 29, 2015

As you are aware, the City of Key West \$250,000 funding commitment enables SWUPS to apply for the FL DOS (2 to 1) grant match. One of the criteria to be used in granting a Historic Preservation Grant is demonstrating local community support of the applicant's proposed project. The SWUPS Board has demonstrated that such local support has been met. And, with the ongoing support of individual and company donors, and the help of public funds, the schooner can be saved.

I recommend to you that the application be approved. Thank you for your attention to this matter.

Historic Tours of America® is company founded in Key West, Florida in 1980 with operations now St. Augustine, FL and four (soon to be five) other national cities.

We now nationally operate in Key West, Boston, Washington D.C., San Diego, St. Augustine and Savannah and are opening next year in Nashville, Tennessee.

We created our company to share historic stories with our guests in the six cities where we give tours including St. Augustine and Key West. During our business life we have also completed 25 historic building renovations. Historic preservation is a core value to our company.

Since the time we first went into business, in the early 1970's, we have been interested in the preservation of the *Schooner Western Union*. We, like many, donated funds to keep her here in Key West.

In 1984 Jimmy Buffet performed a "fundraiser concert" to attempt to save her for the island, however, Key West was on hard times and the *Western Union* was sold. She had her name changed and left Key West and the State of Florida. Up north, she became part of a program to rehabilitate wayward boys who would sail and work to keep her in sailing condition.

Then in 1996 Paul and Evalena Worthington, of the Schooner Wharf Bar, at the Key West Bight came to us with a proposition to bring the Union back to Key West returning her to her origins'. We helped fund her return and bought the historic ship but she was in fairly sorry condition.

Historic Tours of America® is a "private company" and operated her unprofitably for nine years, because of the high cost of wooden ship maintenance and restoration.

However, we were yet still determined to fully restore the ship and have her represent the State and the City of Key West as a symbol of our maritime heritage.

The Western Union proved she can operate and generate close to one million in revenues a year. This is enough to cover expenses and set aside some reserves but the Union needed to generate funds for full restoration and we had no access to historic restoration grants as a private entity.

Twice during the Jeb Bush administration we had her passed unanimously through the Florida House and Senate to become the Flagship of the State of Florida only to be vetoed by Governor Bush. When questioned, Jeb told me that he felt the ship should be the State Flagship but must gain not-for-profit status first.

In October 2007 our company paid off the \$500,000 loan that had been in place since we purchased her and turned her over to a not-for-profit board with a interest group of Key West volunteers who desired to save the Union for the community.

The group, the Schooner Western Union Preservation Society (SWUPS) has raised over \$1.2 million and in 2011 completed phase one of a major two phase total restoration of the 76-yr. old wooden schooner.

SWUPS has now received a \$250,000 Letter of Funding Commitment from the City Key West as a match towards applying for the FL DOS Historic Preservation (two to one) match grant. It should be noted, that 74% of the almost \$2 million required to restore the State of Florida and City of Key West Flagship has been raised from Monroe County public, private and non-profit funds.

With approval the FL DOS Historic Preservation Grant request of \$500,000 submitted SWUPS, the final restoration can be completed and the Flagship returned to service for Florida's visitor and residents to enjoy. Saving this historic ship is a worthy legacy and tribute to Florida's maritime heritage for future generations.

During the past eight years Historic Tours of America® still continued to raise and spend money on behalf of the Western Union. During the initial partial \$1,000,000 restoration from 2009 to 2011 we have paid off bank loans for the *Union* and lent additional matching funds totaling \$613,000. We have charged no interest nor taken any payments in order to further her quest to permanently return to service.

Our requirement of our loans being payable were only if the ship were ever sold to a private entity or, were to depart Key West permanently under any type of ownership. These requirements are no longer necessary because the City and State grants will carry the same restrictive covenants.

Should the State of Florida choose to consummate the grant request for the *Western Union*; then Historic Tours of America® will forgive these liens to make her again debt free.

The Western Union should belong to the people of Key West and the State of Florida.

The schooner's proven million dollar a year income generated from tourist enjoying a Key West sunset sail or a memorable wedding charters are returned to the city and state through crew payrolls, hospitality staff commissions, and local purchase of supplies and hardware.

SWPS as a non-profit and with the states grant assistance to complete the final (76-yr.) major restoration, the State and City Flagship, the *Schooner Western Union* can and should become self-sustaining.

Historic Tours of America® has, to date, contributed over \$2,000,000 to the return and "Preservation of the *Union*" and we believe that she is finally in the position to be saved for the Public Trust. The public loves her and she will continue to represent the City of Key West and the State of Florida well into the future.

The following information from our agent, Ronald S. Taylor, CPCU, CRM, CIC, Executive Vice President - Commercial Lines, HUB International Florida summarizes our current and forecast insurance coverages

We have a Marine General Liability policy renewing 8/1/15 that is roughly \$3,100 annually. We would recommend that be renewed. We do not anticipate significant premium changes on this.

We have a port risk only policy covering the hull and P&I with 1 crew that expires 10/31/15. This premium is \$10,415 annually. We would anticipate this renewing on 10/31 without significant changes in premium.

Come January 2016 I would anticipate the following premium changes: \$1,000 trip coverage to transport the vessel to Tarpon Springs. \$26,000 builders risk coverage (annual) while the vessel is being restored. This would be pro-rata to the period of restoration. If eight months then I would estimate about \$17,500. The current port risk policy would be cancelled the date the builders risk policy is put in force.

WHEREAS, the Schooner Western Union was submitted to the National Register of Historic Places on May 16, 1984; and

WHEREAS, in Resolution No. 97-301, the City of Key West proclaimed the Schooner Western Union the Official Flagship of the City of Key West, and in the Florida State House Rotunda it is listed as the State Flagship of Florida; and

WHEREAS, the Schooner Western Union remains an integral piece of the history of Key West and the Historic Seaport at Key West Bight; and

WHEREAS, the Schooner Western Union requires substantial restoration and upgrades to remain seaworthy, and continue its role as a unique example of living history to educate residents and visitors about the significant role of Key West, and the State of Florida, within maritime history; and

WHEREAS, the Schooner Western Union Preservation Society (SWUPS), a 501(c)3 non-profit organization, is charged with preserving the Schooner Western Union, and has identified a State Historic Preservation grant funding program, which requires a funding match of up to \$250,000.00, towards a restoration project with a total value of up to \$750,000.00; and

WHEREAS, at its meeting of June 10, 2015, the Key West Bight Management District Board considered SWUPS request for a funding Letter of Commitment from the City, in support of their grant application; and

WHEREAS, a Letter of Commitment would enable SWUPS to meet the grant deadline of June 30, 2015 and help to preserve the Schooner Western Union for generations to come; and

WHEREAS, there are sufficient funds in the Key West Bight unrestricted reserves to account for this cost.

Section 1: That a Letter of Commitment, for the amount of up to \$250,000.00, to the Schooner Western Union Preservation Society and Museum is hereby authorized.

Section 2: That any financial commitment set forth in the Letter of Commitment authorized herein on behalf of the Key West Historic Seaport/City of Key West, is contingent upon the award of a State of Florida Historic Preservation Grant for restoration of the Schooner Western Union. City/CRA funds will be used specifically to match the State grant funds in a 50% ratio, up to a total of \$250,000.00.

Section 3: That SWUPS shall agree to execute an agreement to guarantee that the vessel will remain at the Key West Historic Seaport.

Section 4: That no funds shall be expended as a result of this Letter of Commitment without further Resolution of the City Commission.

Section 5: That necessary budget transfers are authorized consistent with this resolution.

Section 6: That the City Manager is authorized to execute a Letter of Commitment for the amount of up to \$250,000.00, as required for grant application purposes for the State of Florida Historic Preservation Grant documents, upon the advice and consent of the City Attorney.

The Key West & Florida Keys community have shown a strong financial commitment to preserve its' maritime heritage by raising 74% of the funds required to restore the State of Florida & City of Key West Flagship, the schooner Western Union.

#### Schooner Western Union important dates and events:

- 1. Launched in April 1939, the 76-yr. old schooner was the last of the iconic coasting schooners built and launched in Key West.
- 2. The schooner maintained the Western Union Telegraph Company undersea telephone and telegraph cables that linked Florida's coastal cities to the Caribbean island nations', Central & South America and the Gulf states. In doing so, the schooner greatly contributed to Florida's economic growth.
- 3. In 2012, the Florida House and Senate voted unanimously to designate the historic schooner the official *Flagship* of the State of Florida.
- 4. The Governor signed the legislation and on July 1, 2012 the schooner Western Union became a state treasure.
- 5. The schooner is now listed high on the state Capitol rotunda wall as the State Flagship.
- 6. The City of Key West passed a resolution in 1997 naming the schooner Western Union the Flagship of the City.
- 7. In 1984, the U.S. Department of Interior placed the schooner on the "National Register of Historic Places".
- 8. Restoration work is performed and inspected to meet the Department of Interior, Historic Renovation Standards
- 9. All work performed will be inspected and approved by the United States Coast Guard
- 10. Among the numerous criteria to have a grant approved is the support of the community of the project. Attached is a (1-pg.) letter detailing how the Monroe County community raised through county, city, non-profit and private donations 74% of the nearly \$2 million required to restore the historic State and City Flagship.
- 11. Approval of the FL DOS \$500,000 grant match will enable completion of the two-part 8-yr. (\$2 million) restoration project to save this state treasurer and maritime legacy for future generations to enjoy.
- 12. The retained (10%) reserve (\$100,000 annually) will fund a required USCG haul-out inspection and on-going maintenance of the vessel every 2-yrs. so to avoid deferred maintenance.
- 13. The \$2 million, 8-yr. major restoration project underway is a 70-80 yr. total over haul on a 130' wooden vessel.
- 14. There is a significant economic benefit to the community: When operating the schooner generates an income of \$1 million a year, of which, 90% of those revenues are returned to the Key West community in the form of local payroll, commissions and local purchased supplies and hardware.
