

An application was received for the removal of (1) Avocado and (1) Strangler Fig tree. A site inspection was done on July 25, 2015 and documented the following:

Tree Species: Avocado (Persea americana)













Diameter: 13.4" Location: 80%


Species: 100% (on protected tree list)

Condition: 50% (fair-codominant trunks, needs maintenance)

Total Average Value = 76%

Value x Diameter = 10 replacement caliper inches

Tree Species: Strangler Fig (Ficus aurea)









Diameter: 2"

Location: 20% (wrong tree, wrong place) Species: 100% (on protected tree list)

Condition: 60% (fair-young) Total Average Value = 57%

Value x Diameter = 1.1 replacement caliper inches

It is recommended that heavy maintenance trimming be done to the avocado tree if it is to remain.

View of front left side of property-permit issued to remove 2-foxtail palms. Rest of vegetation is ornamental-not regulated






In the front left corner of the property near the right of way there is a young red frangipani tree growing. The tree is less than 4" dbh and therefore is not regulated. It is recommended that the tree be preserved or rescued/transplanted.








Andy:

I will need additional information in order to move forward with the application you submitted to remove what you labeled as a mango tree but what is actually an avocado tree. Based on my quick visual review of the avocado tree, I can not make a recommendation to remove the tree. In fact, I recommend heavy maintenance and not removal. If you do not agree with this assessment, I recommend that you have a certified arborist take a close look at the tree and provide an assessment.

I also found a young strangler fig tree very close to the house that is regulated and needs a removal permit. I will recommend removal of that young tree but I need your approval to place it on the application and on the agenda.

By the way, there is a frangipani tree in the front by the foxtail palms. It appears to be a red frangipani and it is not regulated. I recommend, if the frangipani is on private property, that the frangipani be protected during construction or rescued/transplanted. If it is on City property, I will require that it is protected or work to have it rescued/transplanted.

Your application says that new construction is being proposed on this property. It is recommended that a copy of the site plan be submitted to show what the construction plan is. Has the proposed plan been through building and planning review and permitting?
