

NEW TRAFFIC CONTROL BEACON FOR PEDESTRIANS



US 1 and Mile Marker 99.7

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) District Six has activated a new type of pedestrian crossing beacon on US 1 and Mile Marker 99.7. The beacon, a High-intensity Activated Cross Walk signal, or HAWK for short, has proven successful in other parts of the country where it has been installed.

How Does The HAWK Beacon Work?

The unit is typically off until activated by a pedestrian. When a pedestrian wishes to cross the street, they press a button and the signal is activated. It is important to note that the pedestrian must wait for the signal indication to cross.

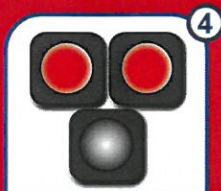
HOW IT WORKS FOR DRIVERS



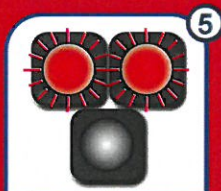
Off until pedestrian needs to cross, drive as usual

Flashing yellow caution, pedestrian wants to cross

Steady yellow be prepared to stop for pedestrian



Solid red
You must stop and remain stopped



Flashing red during pedestrian clearance interval, you can proceed after the pedestrian has cleared your path

HOW IT WORKS FOR PEDESTRIANS

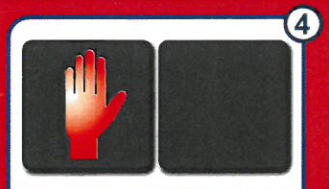


Push button to activate signal

If the display shows the pedestrian walk symbol. You may begin crossing the street



If the display shows a flashing hand signal don't start walking. If you have started, finish crossing with the time remaining



If the display shows a solid stop signal, don't cross until the pedestrian walk symbol returns

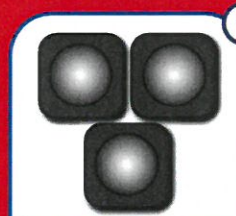


US 1 and Mile Marker 99.7

The HAWK signal uses red lights requiring drivers to come to a complete stop.



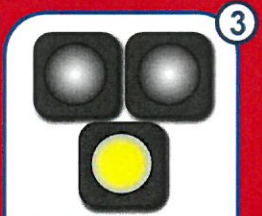
HOW IT WORKS FOR DRIVERS



No lights =
Drive as usual



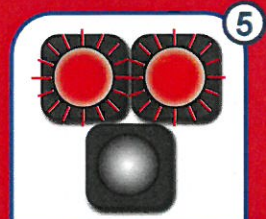
Flashing yellow =
Caution: Pedestrian
is waiting to cross



Steady yellow =
Caution: Pedestrian
is preparing to cross



Solid red =
Stop!
Pedestrian crossing



Flashing red =
Stop! Proceed only
once pedestrian has
cleared your path
