**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF
KEY WEST, FLORIDA, DIRECTING THE RETURN OF THE
TIGER SCULPTURE TO THE NEW CITY HALL AT 1300 WHITE
STREET; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE**

WHEREAS, beginning in the mid-1980s the famed metal sculpted Tiger proudly inhabited the corner of White and United streets at the former Glynn R. Archer school; and

WHEREAS, the Tiger became a beloved symbol and local landmark; and

WHEREAS, the Tiger was removed during the conversion of the school to Key West's new city hall; and

WHEREAS, Key West artist Cayman Smith-Martin generously and meticulously restored the aging Tiger while City Hall was being constructed; and

WHEREAS, construction of City Hall is nearly complete; and

WHEREAS, the Tiger should return to its rightful place of greeting residents and visitors at the corner of White and United Streets.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF KEY WEST, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: That the City Manager is directed to expeditiously return the Tiger to, or as near as possible to, its former location at White and United Streets.

Section 2: That this Resolution shall go into effect immediately upon its passage and adoption and authentication by the signature of the Presiding Officer and the Clerk of the Commission.
