
## **STAFF REPORT**

**DATE:** November 3, 2016

**RE:** Administrative Hearing, 1116 Packer Street

On August 31, 2016, while reviewing a building permit to build a fence on the property I noticed that a coconut had been removed from the property and a large diameter cut had been made to the Spanish lime tree along the property line, both without benefit of a permit. In April 2016 I had been on the property due to a pool application and had taken photos of the area. An inspection of the property documented the following:

- 1. A Spanish stopper tree had been removed from the ground and placed into a pot (transplanting of tree without a permit) in order to have access along the side of the property for building of the pool.
- 2. Poor cuts were made to a mango tree (tree abuse).
- 3. Poor cuts were made to a Spanish Lime tree which required a heavy maintenance trimming permit due to size of one of the cuts.
- 4. A regulated frangipani tree has been removed from the back yard without benefit of a removal permit. The tree was approximately 6"-8" diameter.
- 5. A Coconut palm has been removed without benefit of a removal permit.

In reviewing the application for a fence I noticed in the photos that a large diameter branch had been cut from the Spanish lime tree and a coconut palm is missing from the corner. Who trimmed the tree and removed the palm? The trimming work required a tree permit due to the size of the branch and a permit is required to remove coconut palms, a protected tree species. No permits had been issued for either work. I am now concerned about other trees in the backyard that maybe missing or trimmed without permits. I was on that property in April 2016 with the pool guys and took photos of the conditions at that time. Once I inspect the property I will let you know definitively what the issues are.



Subject: 1116 Packer Street

I inspected the property yesterday and this is what I found:

- A Spanish stopper tree that used to be along the side of the houses is missing. A similar looking tree is now living across the yard. Did this tree get transplanted? If so, is it in the ground or in a pot? Who did this work? A permit is required to transplant protected trees.
- A regulated frangipani tree is missing from the back yard. What happened to it? A permit is required to remove a frangipani tree greater than 4 inches diameter.
- 3. Poor cuts were made on this protected tree (tree abuse?).
- 4. A protected coconut palm was removed. A permit is required.
- 5. A poor cut was made to the Spanish lime tree. This sized cut required a heavy maintenance trimming permit.

Attached are some photos from when I was on the property in April 2016 and yesterday.


