**A RESOLUTION OF THE ART IN PUBLIC PLACES BOARD
OF THE CITY OF KEY WEST, FLORIDA; RECOGNIZING
THE RESTORATION AND RE-INSTALLATION OF THE
WILLIAM H. HOFFMAN FEDERAL ART PROJECT (WORKS
PROGRESS ADMINISTRATION) MURALS IN THE
AUDITORIUM AT JOSEPHINE PARKER CITY HALL AT
THE HISTORIC GLYNN R. ARCHER SCHOOL AS PUBLIC
ART FOR WHICH THE CITY IS ENTITLED TO A CREDIT
AGAINST ITS REQUIRED 1% CONTRIBUTION TO THE ART
IN PUBLIC PLACES PROGRAM.**

WHEREAS, during the reconstruction and repurposing of the auditorium at the historic Glynn R. Archer School building, historically significant murals, painted by William H. Hoffman as a Works Progress Administration Project in 1936, were carefully removed and restored; and

WHEREAS, the restored murals have been on public display at the Key West International Airport during the construction period, and will be returned to their rightful position in the auditorium at Josephine Parker City Hall at the Historic Glynn R. Archer School, where they will remain on permanent public display; and

WHEREAS, the City of Key West expended funds to have the murals restored and;

WHEREAS, Assistant City Manager Greg Valez appeared before the AIPP Board to present the City's information and supporting

documentation for the actual costs of the restoration through Art Conservation Services in the minimum amount of \$66,271.11 which this Board finds to be a reasonable fee for the restoration of the Murals; and

WHEREAS, the Board finds that said cost falls within the definition of artwork or works of art as provided in Section 2-487 (b) of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Key West;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE ART IN PUBLIC PLACES BOARD OF THE CITY OF KEY WEST, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: The Art in Public Places Board recognizes that the restoration and return of the WPA murals to the City Commission Chambers/Auditorium at the Josephine Parker City Hall at the Historic Glynn R. Archer School building satisfies, in part, the City's obligations under Section 2-487(c) of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Key West and that the sum of \$66,271.11 shall be applied to the 1% Public Art set-aside required by restoration of City Hall.

Section 2: That this Resolution shall go into effect immediately upon its passage and adoption and authentication by

the signature of the presiding officer.
