Sec. 122-\_\_\_. Accessory Uses.

## Accessory uses are permitted pursuant to Sec. 122-1181, including:

- (1) Bicycle tours,
- (2) Business and professional offices
- (3) Alcohol sales conducted within the community and cultural facilities can be located in the HMSAC designated area.

The KW Code doesn't generally list permitted accessory uses, so this language may help clarify that the listed uses are not the only accessory uses allowed.
