A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF KEY WEST, FLORIDA, AUTHORIZING PURSUANT TO SECTION 2-771(c) OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES THE DISPOSAL OF FOUR (4)SURPLUS AND OBSOLETE CITY BUSES; AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER EXECUTE TO NECESSARY DOCUMENTS; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE

WHEREAS, four City-owned buses, originally acquired for more than \$20,000.00, are surplus and obsolete, and City staff recommends disposal of the vehicles to the highest bidder; and

WHEREAS, the Florida Department of Transportation has provided documentation to KWDOT, granting the approval and release of Lien/Certificate of Titles for these buses, and authorized the City KWDoT to "utilize as you wish;" and

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF KEY WEST, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: That the disposal of four (4) obsolete City buses, as described in the attached memorandum from Norman Whitaker, Director, KWDOT, dated December 14, 2016 is authorized as follows: Bus #805 will be repurposed for law enforcement and fire safety emergency drills; buses 807 and 808 will be disposed to the highest bidder, or donated if acceptable bids are not received, and bus #815 will have usable parts removed, and then be disposed of, pursuant to the best removal scrap offer received.

Section 2: That the City Manager, upon advice and consent of
the City Attorney, is authorized to execute all necessary documents.
Section 3: That this Resolution shall go into effect immediately
