WHEREAS, we believe that a peaceable world is possible when every man, woman and child treats others as they wish to be treated--with dignity, equity and respect; and,

WHEREAS, various churches, synagogues, places of worship, businesses, families and individuals in the Keys are being recognized for hosting and participating in the Week of Peace activities; and,

WHEREAS, Tibetan Buddhist Monks from H.H. Dalai Lama's Drepung Gomang Monastery will be visiting Key West to offer blessings of peace, compassion, health, happiness and prosperity for our environment, our community and families during the week of January 7-15, 2017; and,
