SUBJECT: Purchase of three (3) Toyota Prius C Hybrid

ACTION STATEMENT: Authorizes the purchase of three (3) Toyota Prius C Hybrid from Duncan Auto Sales for \$56,630.00, pursuant to the City of Key West code section 2-797 (3), purchases and acquisitions under contracts of federal government and the state or its political subdivisions,via the Florida Sheriffs Association and Florida Association of Counties Bid No. FSA16-VEL24.0. Section 2-797 (3) (b) provides local vendors the opportunity to compete with Florida Sheriffs Association and Florida Association and Florida Association of Counties Bid No. FSA16-VEL24.0.

BACKGROUND:

On October 1, 2016 the Florida Sheriffs Association and the Florida Association of Counties published a memorandum stating they have successfully conducted its 24th statewide competitive bid for vehicles which includes trucks, backhoes, motor graders, agriculture type tractors, skid steer loaders and regenerative air street sweepers. The contract is effective beginning October 1, 2016 through September 30, 2017.

The terms and conditions of the original contract are extended and guaranteed to any and all units of local governments and political subdivisions including, but not limited to, county, local county board of public instruction, municipalities and/or police agencies, other local public or public safety agencies or authorities within the State of Florida as listed on page 2 of the Florida Sheriffs Association and Florida Association of Counties Bid No. FSA16-VEL24.0.

The Toyota Prius listed in the Florida Sheriffs Association and Florida Association of Counties Bid No. FSA16-VEL24.0 is a 2017 Toyota Prius C Hybrid (p.299). This is the base model. There are options listed as

add/delete in the bid that allow the end user to configure the equipment according to his/her requirements.

City of Key West code section 2-797 requires the verification that the items to be procured are not available locally. In this case, such vehicles are available and Duncan Auto Sales has elected to match the prices published in the Florida Sheriffs Association and Florida Association of Counties Bid No. FSA16-VEL24.0 contract.

PURPOSE AND JUSTIFICATION: The City of Key West relies on various departments and internal functions to operate on a daily basis. These job functions require regular travel throughout the City to perform a variety of work related tasks. The reliability of transportation and equipment for these positions directly impacts the performance of many departments throughout the entire City.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

The total in the FY 2016-2017 operating budget is \$59,793 and is funded by account number 101.1900-519.64. There are two Prius for the Building Department and one for Code Compliance.
