Dear Mr. Beaver:

This is in further response to your July 10, 2016, Freedom of Information Act request, received by the Civil Rights Division's Freedom of Information/Privacy Act Branch on August 3, 2016, seeking access to records regarding a letter sent from the Civil Rights Division to Chief Donald Lee of the Key West Police Department.

After review of the responsive Civil Rights Division documents, I have determined that the documents may be released to you subject to the excision of the names and other identifying information of private citizens, pursuant to 5 U.S.C. § 552 (b)(7)(C) since disclosure thereof could reasonably be expected to constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy. I have also determined that access to some of the documents should be denied pursuant to 5 U.S.C. §552(b)(5), since the records consist of attorney work product and include intra-agency memoranda containing pre-decisional, deliberative material.

In addition, this office located documents that originated with the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI). Pursuant to Department of Justice regulations, 28 C.F.R. § 16.1 et seq., a copy of your request and the responsive documents has been referred to the originating agency for review and a direct response to you.
