An application was received requesting the removal of **(2) Royal Poinciana and (1) Sapodilla tree**. A site inspection was done on February 24, 2017 and documented the following:

Tree #3 (Royal Poinciana) Tree #2 (Sapodilla) Tree #1 (Royal Poinciana)














R1 Diameter: 25.5"

Location: 70% (close to property line and fence)


Species: 100% (on protected tree list)

Condition: 30% (very poor, codominant trunks with included bark low in

trunk, decay throughout tree)
Total Average Value = 66%


Value x Diameter = 16.8 replacement caliper inches

Location: 60% (close to property line and neighbor's house)


Species: 100% (on protected tree list)


Condition: 40% (health poor, structurally poor, decay)

Total Average Value = 66%


Value x Diameter = 7.5 replacement caliper inches


Tree Species: Sapodilla (Manilkara zapota)

Location: 70% (close to property line) Species: 100% (on protected tree list)

Condition: 20% (very poor-diseased, decay)

Total Average Value = 63%

Value x Diameter = 17.6 replacement caliper inches

Note: Two large mahogany trees on the property will be trimmed and (2) Washingtonian Palms in the front yard will be removed (staff approval permits).

Recommendation: Recommend approval of the removal of two (2) Royal Poinciana trees and (1) Sapodilla tree at 3717 Eagle Avenue to be replaced with 41.9 caliper inches of dicot or fruit trees from approved list, FL#1, to be planted on site.
