SUBJECT: Donation Installation: Orange Head

ACTION STATEMENT

The AIPP Advisory Board has determined that the Orange Head Sculpture donation should be accepted by the City of Key West for installation on the campus of the City of Key West's Josephine Parker City Hall at Historic Glynn Archer School. The Board should determine if the Sculpture will be sited on the campus independently or as part of an overall Public Art site plan for the campus, to be developed at the conclusion of the upcoming RFP process.

BACKGROUND

An RFP is being developed for Public Art installations on the overall campus of the City of Key West's Josephine Parker City Hall at Historic Glynn Archer School. The request indicates multiple locations throughout the campus as potential sites for Public Art installation. The Orange Head Sculpture is to be sited on the campus, in addition to new works to be commissioned through the RFP process.

PURPOSE & JUSTIFICATION

Considering an overall plan, inclusive of both newly commissioned works and the existing, donated work will provide continuity to the campus aesthetic and promote a cohesive approach to the promotion of the "Island of the Arts".

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the Orange Head Sculpture location on the campus of the City of Key West's Josephine Parker City Hall at Historic Glynn Archer School be determined when all works to be installed on the campus, both new and existing, can be sited within a comprehensive campus-wide Public Art Plan. It is recommended that the City assume the low costs of installation through the AIPP fund.

FINANCIAL IMPACT

The donors, based on the overall costs of installation, may support a percentage of the installation costs. A location must be determined to establish what those costs will be; however, based on the prior installation of the work and similarly installed pieces it is estimated that the total installation would cost approximately \$250. It is recommended that the City assume the low costs of installation through the AIPP fund. The donors are cleaning and restoring the work prior to donating it for installation.
