Re: 2017-04 KWBB / schooner Western Union Restoration Progress Report

- **A.** Richard Manley, board member and Restoration Project Director made another visit at the of April to the MarPro Tarpon Springs boatyard (at his expense.)
 - a. Transom is nearly complete.
 - **b.** Hull planking fitting and epoxy work continues.
 - **c.** Keel is being fiber glassed in preparation of the steel shoe to be installed over the keel.
 - d. The steel for the shoe is being cut and fitted to be ready to install on keel.
- **B.** U.S. Coast Guard has approved fiber glassing the deck to stop the rain leaks that create wet rot below deck. A synthetic material that looks and feels like teak and commonly used on boat decks will be installed over the fiber glass.
 - **a.** This action will end a serious recurring problem that creates expense and thus is approved by the Dept. of Interior for Historic Vessel Restoration.
- **C.** SWU Capt. Lenn Verreau, who is living on his vessel at the MarPro boatyard dock and is being compensated by SWUPS to oversee the restoration had a health event and was taken by ambulance to Florida Hospital, Tarpon Springs. After two days of testing in the hospital it was determined he had a Vertigo attack which has symptoms like a heart attack. Lenn has been released and will be ok.
 - **a.** At his request, Lenn is also working under a canopy sanding the boat rails to move the project along and save expense.
- **D.** We are hoping to receive the second FL DOS grant funds payment of \$125,000 soon.
 - **a.** A short-term interest free \$50,000 bridge loan was supplied by the goodwill of HTA (vessel donor) so we could pay the boatyard and continue work.
