## RE: 901 Caroline Street (Flagler Station)

FROM: Karen DeMaria, City of Key West Urban Forestry Manager

On March 13, 2018, I was contacted by the director and deputy director of Port and Marine Services, Doug Bradshaw and Karen Olson, regarding the removal of a protected Thatch Palm at the Flagler Station. It was discovered that the palm was removed without benefit of a removal permit.

In August 2016, an e-mail from Karen Olson requested information regarding the potential removal of this planter. My response stated that the thatch palm was protected.

Thatch Palms are a protected trees species in the City of Key West and are on the State of Florida Endangered Species list. The palm that was removed was approximately 8 ft tall CT (clear trunk) and was growing in an elevated planter. This palm would have been a great candidate for transplanting.











Recommendation: Recommend the respondent be required to purchase 1 or 2 Thatch Palm trees, minimum 8 ft tall CT to be planted at the Key West Bight in the area, as approved by City staff.
