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Criteria for Residential Parking Numbers per Block

A motion was made by Mr. Davila, seconded by Mr. Detwiler, that the Item "Set Criteria for Residential Parking Numbers Per Block" be Passed as amended recommending criteria that any block in the residential zone have at least 50 percent residential spaces, blocks adjacent to City of Key West paid parking have at least 75 percent residential paces and blocks with parkingon only one side of the street have at least 75 percent residential spaces. A motion was made by Mr. Davila, seconded by Mr. Detwiler, that the Item "Parking Capacity" be Passed to consider opportunities to add paid public parking capacity while simultaneously removing a like amount of street parking to achieve safer streets for all users by improving intersection line of sight and adding dedicated and separated bike lanes to certain streets; to identify and adopt planning policies to incentivise private landowners to undertake development of additional paid parking in the Core Commercial District. The motion carried by the following vote:

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21 Affordable Housing Project Proposed on College Road

A motion was made by Mr. Detwiler, seconded by Mr. Davila, that the Item "Affordable Housing Project Proposed by the City on College Road' be Passed recommending the City encourage developers to facilitate alternative transportation by waiving the minimum parking requirements and substituting additional bicycle and scooter parking, designing carpooling and vanpooling programs and providing convenient public transit options. The motion carried by the following vote:

Street Capacity Considerations

A motion was made by Mr. Detwiler, seconded by Mr. Davila, that the Item "Street Capacity Considerations" be Passed identifying business licensing regulations to control and or reduce the number and type of commercial vehicles using City streets alleviating traffic congestion and to consider assessing additional impact fees to commercial road users and restricting such fees to improvement in alternative transportation to the extent permitted by law. The motion carried by the following vote:
