


- Energy audit utilizing monitoring equipment at City Hall at Glynn Archer.

- Separate metering for athletic field lighting (due to account reclass and demand billing).
 - o Estimated budget \$5,000 (funded in FY2019 budget).
 - o Design & photometrics completed and quotes requested for Bocce Court lighting.
- Minor controls additions to City Hall Lutron lighting control system.
 - o Estimated budget \$2,000 (funded in FY2019 budget).
- Install permanent energy monitoring equipment at City Hall at Glynn Archer.
 - o Supplement existing Building Automation System already capable of energy monitoring.
 - o Estimated budget \$8,000 (funded in FY2019 budget).
- Obtain quotes for relocating irrigation pump to deeper of two cisterns.


Note that:

On August 27, 2018 performance metrics in Portfolio Manager were updated for U.S. buildings to reflect current market data. You may notice a change in your current and historic 1-100 ENERGY STAR score or other metrics.

This update has apparently lowered City Hall's Energy Star score from a qualifying **83** to an ineligible **65**. Further research will be conducted to determine whether this major downgrade is warranted.
