Hello Mr Bradshaw and Key West Bight Board,

We the owners of Calypso Watersports and Charters would like to ensure we have the opportunity to be approved by the board at the Bight Marina so that some of our charters have the ability to come to dock during their charters.

We have leased this slip for approx 5 years I believe.

The vessel Isola offers extended charters. She is a 4 bedroom 2 bathroom Leopard catamaran and is a 2018 model. I have attached her specifications list which shows water tank, holding tank capacity etc, pictures of all four bedrooms and a floor plan so that you can see she also has two bathrooms onboard.

Each charter that we fulfill has its own charter contract. If the charter ever wants to come into dock during that time and stay the night on the dock they are instructed that they always call the Dockmaster just to let him know when they are coming back to dock.

I haver attached our contact list which is laminated on all vessels - it has the Dockmaster number on there as well as our owners and staff info.

So far in 2019 Isola has the following dates booked. The purpose of these charter sis to go visit the Marquesas Islands, Dry Tortugas or travel up the Keys Islands - we also offer 8hr day trips. We would never advertise Airbnb or Boatel type charters for two main reasons.

- 1. We personally feel there is too many things that could get broken or malfunction letting guests stay unattended. It is a very valuable vessel. The liability of them possibly drinking and falling off the boat even at dock is one that we would not want to take.
- 2. I sit on the DAC for the upper keys. I understand the implications of renting out boats like hotel rooms and not paying bed tax. The only groups that are allowed on our vessels have a charter contract to go sailing. It is a lovely spot to come back to during a charter and refuel, fill water tanks etc and go visit Key West restaurants and attractions lots of our charters like to do so. It is in their charter instructions to call the Dockmaster to always

let him know when they are coming back to dock - the reason that this is important is because the Dockmaster (within our charter contract) has the ability to subcontract our spot out if we are not using it so I always make sure that the guests let him know when they are coming in and the spot is available.

During these charters we might like to come back to dock - or begin the charter sleeping aboard (for instance if the guest arrive from a late flight as we do not allow night sailing) sometimes once or twice in a charter. We also like them to come back to dock especially in adverse weather. I would be happy to keep a detailed log of this for you if you could instruct me on a procedure of where to send it. - my charter log can also be available for you - although this includes the time at sea. Every guest name and telephone number is always in my files and also I have them sign a waiver for water activities at sea with their name address and signature. I keep all these paperworks for years. The average time that a seven day charter is at dock is usually a night at beginning and a night at end as well as a return to dock to fuel/water etc..

This is how she is described on our website: Our website is calypssailing.com - you can see that we do not Market boatel types of trips. Our charter rate is 6850 per week so far more expensive than a hotel.

Isola is a 40ft Leopard catamaran with four bedrooms and two bathrooms. This yacht has been meticulously designed for comfort, safety, and the blue water lifestyle and her sleek exterior and elegant lines make her an attractive choice for your perfect charter experience.

EXTERIOR

Isola's exterior is the ultimate in cruising luxury. Life Threatening Situation – Use VHF and call MAYDAY on channel 16. If in Range call 911. If in the Bahamas and equipped with SAT Phone call the USCG Station Miami at: (305) 253-1527 Vessel is In Imminent Danger – Do all the above.

Run Aground and Stuck – Put an anchor out in deeper water as far as you can by dinghy to keep the vessel from running further aground. Call Seatow or Boat US if you have membership. In the Keys be careful not to disturb the seagrass or you may incur a large fine. Try healing the vessel over if it has a spade keel. Make note of your position and time in the log and call the charter company for any additional help.

Engine Breakdown - Call the charter company on your cell phone or sat phone.
