## **Action Statement:**

This resolution will allow the City Manager to negotiate and execute an agreement with a contractor based on the proposal and the evaluation committee for the purpose of Emergency Management Debris Staging Area.

# Background:

The City requested proposals from any prospective contactors. The RFP #002-19 was issued on September 21, 2018 and all proposals were accepted by October 10, 2018. The City received a proposal from one (1) contractor;

1. Toppino and Sons, INC.

The proposals were ranked by the following evaluating committee;

- 1. Alan Averette, KWFD
- 2. Mike Turner, Public Works
- 3. Steve McAlearney, Engineering

The ranking committee met on November 1, 2018 and found the one proposal to be responsible, responsive, and cost-efficient.

## Financial Impact:

In the event of a Federally Declared storm or other disaster and the service of an emergency management consulting contractor is needed, typically the City would pay 12.5% of the total cost of services if a declaration of emergency is signed by the Governor of the State of Florida. The remainder of costs would be reimbursed by FEMA at 75% and the State of Florida at 12.5%. In the event of a storm or disaster that does not rise to the level of being Federally declared then the City would be responsible for 100 percent of the cost of removal and/or monitoring. Under either scenario the City's funding responsibility would be from the General Fund's operating contingency.

#### Recommendation:

Allow the City Manager to negotiate and execute an agreement with a contractor based on the proposal.
