On September 22, 2019 I, Ofc. Waite, was dispatched to the Smallest Bar located at 124 Duval Street in reference to a trespasser. Ofc. Litton, who was also dispatched to this call, advised me that he was familiar with the trespasser, identified later as Joseph Biellier, as he had dealt with him earlier at the same location. Ofc. Litton described Biellier to me and noted that he should have a dog with him. Ofc Litton advised that he spoke with the caller and was advised that Biellier had left the area.

Ofc. Litton located Biellier and his dog on Wall Street. I responded so Ofc. Litton could return to the Smallest Bar and find out more information from the caller. Biellier's body clothing were filthy and he was barefoot. Biellier 's dog tremored in his presence. As I asked Biellier for his name and date of birth, I held my flashlight to my notepad. Biellier became extremely agitated and asked that I do not shine my flashlight in his face. During this call, any time Biellier was exposed to bright lights he would scream and turn his body completely away from the source. When Biellier would speak he would shout, and it did not appear as if he could complete a thought. I asked Biellier if he takes any medication and he told me he takes his dogs medication.

Ofc. Litton returned and advised that he did not believe Biellier could be charged with trespassing due to the information he received at the bar. I notified Ofc. Litton on my observations of Biellier and we agreed that he met the Baker Act criteria due to his apparent altered mental status.

Ofc. Litton and I approached Biellier, who was laying over the top of the dog and had his arms around the dog's neck. I notified Biellier that he was being placed into protective custody. Biellier grabbed onto his dog and began to shout. Ofc. Litton and I told Biellier to let go of the dog and he refused. I grabbed Biellier by his arm, bent his wrist inward, and rolled him on to his stomach and away from the dog. Ofc. Litton took the dog leash and walked the dog away from Biellier. I placed Biellier into a three-point pin and Ofc. Litton assisted me in handcuffing him behind the back. As I attempted to sit Biellier upright he attempted to get his hands to the front of his body. I ordered Biellier to place his hands behind his back as he continued to resist. I attempted to get Biellier's hands to the back of his body, but he went into the fetal position, trapping the chain of the handcuffs behind his knees. This was an attempt to prevent me from placing his arms behind his back. I conducted pain compliance by using the hollow behind the ear pressure point technique. Biellier showed extremely high pain tolerance before placing his hands behind his back.

Ofc. Litton requested rescue and notified Sgt. Vazquez of the use of force.

Key West Rescue 2 responded to evaluate Biellier. Rescue advised Biellier was exhibiting behavior consistent with excited delirium and issued him a shot of Ketamine to sedate him. I rode with Rescue as they transported Biellier to Lower Keys Medical Center (LKMC).

It is my opinion that without care or treatment Biellier would be likely to suffer from self-neglect and refuse to care for himself, and such neglect or refusal poses a real and present threat of substantial harm to his wellbeing and it is not apparent that such harm may be avoided through the help of willing family members or friends or the provision of other services. It is also my opinion there is a substantial likelihood that without care or treatment Biellier could cause serious bodily harm to himself and others.

My BWC was activated during this call and will be uploaded into evidence.

On 09/22/2019 at approximately 2345 hours, Officer K. Waite and I (Ofc. A. Litton) was dispatched to 124 Duval Street, the Smallest Bar, in reference to a subject that was trespassed earlier that night.

When I arrived at the Smallest Bar, the bartender said the subject left North on Duval Street. The subject, Joseph Biellier, was located on Wall Street, behind the Ocean Key Resort. Biellier was walking from the parking lot under Ocean Key with his dog. We have a recent history of calls with Biellier due to the public's concern with his dog's well-being, which is why we had contact with him earlier at the Smallest Bar. We received a call from 202 Duval, Rick's Bar, where employees stated they saw Biellier "kick his dog and throw hot pizza at him."

I sat Biellier on the curb until Officer Waite arrived, so I could talk to the bartender at the Smallest Bar. The bartender stated Biellier and the dog stepped into the bar and left after he was told to leave. I did not see Biellier in the bar.

When I went back to Wall Street and met with Officer Waite, concerned for his mental status, we asked Biellier if he has any psychiatric history or was supposed to take any medications. Biellier stated he was taking his dog's medication. Biellier now was holding his dog with two arms around his neck. The dog was shaking uncontrollably. When we told Biellier that we were going to get him help, he tightened his grip around the dog's neck. Biellier went into a high emotional, excited delirium, state. We were worried the dog would be harmed by Biellier, so we removed his arms from the dog, placed them behind his back and handcuffed him. I took control of the dog, so it would not run out into the street, and Officer Waite asked Biellier to sit up. Biellier agreed to sit up but proceeded to try and slide his hands under his legs to put them in front of him. Officer Waite and I stopped Biellier from placing his hands to his front, but he locked them behind his knees. Biellier would not follow simple directions and was acting very irrational, screaming and making nonsense comments.

Biellier would not return his hands behind his back and Officer Waite had to physically move Biellier's hands back behind him. Biellier suffered a slight abrasion to the right side of his forehead in this process. Key West Rescue 2 responded to the scene to treat the abrasions. Biellier was in too much of an excited state to be transported to De Poo. Biellier was sedated by Key West Rescue 2 and transported to Lower Keys Medical Center for a Baker Act (See Officer Waite's initial report).

Axon BWC was activated during this incident.
