1. **Truman Waterfront Park** --3 Bike racks from Jim Gallucci Sculpture delivery/installation by artist on January 18-19. Working on powerpoint of the City Commission meeting with Alison Higgins for January 22 meeting to receive “acceptance” of the Civic Moxie finished Master Arts & Culture plan for the park.
2. **1400 Duval Park/Mall-** Colin Selig 4 benches installed. 5th one scheduled delivery on January 9th. Call for sculpture on loan in process *with legal* department. *Also* – met with DeeDee Green and Tim from the City regarding signage, garbage cans, cigarette receptacles and bike racks! All moving forward -
3. **City Hall** public art installations – Salem complete, Allen complete, Gray’s 2 book benches complete, paid, signs installed. *Gilbert in process – maybe January – ongoing.*
4. **KW Seaport** Public Art project – *RFP in process, no further updates*
5. **Mallory Square** – meet with city engineer – discussed signage

7. **Truman Waterfront Park Amphitheater** – *signage honoring Coffee Butler, “still” hoping for a meeting*
8. **Private/City – Zero Duval Street** – *met again with Scott Saunders and this meeting included City Risk Manager Todd Stoughton – putting a timeline and “plan” to move forward in place*
9. Private -**Banana Bay** – No updates
10. Private - **725 Duval St** – getting info on 1% private – major development restoration
11. Collections Management – *app* ready to go, need to work with each board member - *ongoing*
12. Ongoing Projects spreadsheet –*Updates received from Terry Justice, need to now get schedule of values for next steps....*
