On 01/01/2020 at approximately 0140 hours, Sgt Vazquez and I, Officer Purcell, where conducting routine patrol when we were flagged down in reference to a fight at 512 Greene St.

I entered the bar and observed a large crowd of people attempting to separate two adult males. I escorted one of the males (Jason Wolf) outside while Sgt Vazquez placed the other male (James Carter) in custody.

I spoke with Wolf who stated Carter ran into the bar yelling and acting aggressively. Wolf told me he attempted to stop Carter. Wolf stated Carter head butted him in the face. I observed two small cuts on the bridge of Wolf's nose and a bruise forming around his left eye. I photographed Wolf's injuries.

Bystanders in the bar confirmed Wolf's statement and said Carter also kicked down a door inside the bar.

The owner of the Bar stated he witnessed the incident and confirmed Wolf's statement. The owner said he did not wish to press charges for the damage to the door.

Carter was escorted to the Monroe County Detention processing station set up at the old city hall on Ann St. While at the processing station Cater, still in handcuffs, ran out the door in an attempt to escape custody. Carter was promptly tackled, hobbled, and brought back to the processing station. Carter sustained minor abrasions on his arms and legs.

Based on the facts and evidence, I believe there is probable cause, that on 01/01/2020, James Carter did knowingly and intentionally strike Jason Wolf in the face against his will, in violation of FSS 784.03. I also believe there is probable cause, that on 01/01/2020, James Carter did Knowingly and intentionally commit acts to affect the peace and quiet, as well as endanger the safety, of the individuals who witnessed them in a licensed establishment, in violation of FSS 509.143. I believe there is also probable cause that James Carter did knowingly and intentionally resist sworn officers in the performance of their duties without violence, in violation of FSS 843.02.

Carter was transported to the Monroe County Detention Center without incident.

Carter had two active warrants out of Monroe County. One warrant for driving a motorcycle without an endorsement, and one warrant for battery touch or strike.

This investigation was recorded with my Axon BWC.

On 1/1/20, at approximately 0140 hours, I (Sgt. M. Siracuse) was at the mobile command center (510 Greene Street) for New Years Eve.

I had just finished processing a Marchman act when a woman came running out of the Shots and Giggles bar and began yelling for help. Sgt. Vazquez, Ofc. Purcell, and several other Officers who were at the command center went running into the bar with me. I activated my BWC.

As we entered the bar we began separating individuals who had been involved in a physical altercation. I passed through the main crowd and handcuffed a black male, later identified as James Carter. Carter was who most of the witnesses were pointing at as the primary aggressor.

Sgt. Vazquez and I walked Carter out of the bar and sat him in a chair at the temporary intake section of Old City Hall. Sgt. Vazquez asked Carter some basic questions. Carter sat silently without answering the questions. Sgt. Vazquez walked away and I stood by Carter with Det. J. Hammers. I asked Carter more questions about what took place inside the bar. Carter was reluctant to speak to me and eventually stopped talking to me and just sat silently.

After a few minutes I turned off my BWC and was about to leave and return to my post for the detail. Shortly after turning off my BWC, I saw Carter jump up, start yelling, and begin running southbound into the parking lot behind Old City Hall. I ran after Carter and shoved him to the ground. Det. Hammers assisted me in holding down Carter while I knelt on his upper back. Carter was yelling very loudly. I re-activated my BWC while Detective H. del Valle and Sgt. Vazquez assisted in placing hobbles on Carter. Once restrained with a hobble, we lifted Carter and walked him back into the intake section of Old City Hall.

Ofc. Purcell took over the battery investigation and processed him for the crimes he had committed. I returned to my post and had no further involvement in the incident.
