On April 5, 2020, at approximately 1611 hours, I (Ofc Valdes Marrero) responded to 1300 White St (City Hall), in reference to a trespasser.

Sgt. Rodriguez was on scene with a male subject (later identified as Victor Goldberg) who was sitting on top of the tiger statue. Sgt. Rodriguez asked Goldberg to get off the tiger several times and Goldberg refused to comply. Sgt. Rodriguez also smelled a strong odor of burnt marijuana and saw Goldberg smoking a cigarette. It was later determined the cigarette was a hemp cigarette, which smells like illegal marijuana. Sgt Rodriguez told Goldberg to place his hands behind his back to detain him, pending the outcome of the investigation. Goldberg refused to comply with Sgt Rodriguez's orders and instead decided to run into traffic at the intersection of United St. / White St., which is a busy intersection.

As I was arriving at the scene, I observed Sgt. Rodriguez running after Goldberg towards the laundry-mat. I immediately got out of my patrol vehicle and assisted Sgt Rodriguez. I displayed my agency issued Taser device and told Goldberg to put his hands behind his back. Goldberg refused to comply with my commands and kept walking away. I grabbed Goldberg's arm and I redirected him to the ground to place him into custody. While on the ground, Goldberg was yelling for officers to kill him and shoot him. Goldberg continued resisting by tensing up and refused to put his hands behind his back. I used my Taser dry stun device on Goldberg's thigh to achieve compliance due to the level of active resistance he was displaying. Once other officers arrived on scene, we were able to place Goldberg into custody.

It was later determined Goldberg suffers from epilepsy and seizures. Due to his conditions, Goldberg was taken to LKMC as a baker act instead of an arrest. Goldberg repeatedly said he wanted to die and wanted officers to shoot him. Goldberg displayed wanton disregard to his safety and the safety of others. I have reasons to believe Goldberg will refuse to care for himself and no one else is able to care for him. Due to all the conditions, Goldberg meets criteria as an involuntary baker act.

This incident was recorded with my in-car patrol camera and my Axon body worn camera. Both videos were uploaded to the server as evidence.

On 4/5/2020, at about 1610 hours, I made contact with a suspect at 1300 White Street. The suspect was sitting on the tiger statue, in front of Key West City Hall, with an electric guitar. I observed him for a few seconds and asked what he was doing and told him to get off of it, he apologized and said he was stupid and had seizures. He dismounted the tiger and sat at a bench, a few feet behind the tiger. I drove around the block and noticed he had climbed on the tiger again and was smoking what smelled strongly like marijuana. I approached him and asked if I had told him to get off the tiger and he replied again by stating he had seizures and was stupid. He sat with his legs crossed and appeared to be concealing the marijuana cigarettes on his right side. I ordered him off the tiger and told him to get on the ground. He placed the cigarettes on the ground, said he did not want to and ran away with his guitar and suit thought the middle of the intersection. As he ran, he yelled for help. Officer Marrero directed him to the ground in a controlled manner and drive stunned his right arm, as we tried to handcuff him, while he resisted by pulling away and attempting to grab my leg. The suspect was later identified as Victor Goldberg. Goldberg appeared to be either mentally handicapped or under the influence of drugs. It was my assessment that it would be appropriate to get him medical help. RRI completed. No injuries noted. Goldberg went to the emergency room for evaluation.
