Karen,

It was great meeting you today. We love and enjoy our trees and currently have approximately 50-60% of our yard covered with canopy. Along with other types of trees, we have 3 gumbo limbo trees. We are requesting to remove only 1 of the gumbo limbo trees that is creating several concerns for us.

Due to the location of the tree and because the roots grow above ground, it is causing damage to a brick wall. This concerns us for several reasons. As it continues to worsen, we are worried that the wall could potentially fall causing harm to our granddaughter who comes to visit, our dog, our neighbor's pets, and us. Our family, friends, and we often trip over the roots. The flies that are attracted to this particular tree produce a toxic substance that burns our skin and our dog's skin. The tree itself emits a sticky sap that causes issues with our dog's fur.

We also have concerns with the costs associated with this tree including the ongoing repairs to the wall and spraying the tree.

The tree in question also prevents us from being able to utilize that particular area of our yard as the roots take up over 300 sq. ft. of it. It has prohibited us from starting the process of having a storage shed built. We feel that a shed is needed in which to store and safely secure our personal items, keeping our yard cleaned up. Having a neat and tidy yard would also help us to eliminate unintentionally creating mosquito habitats.

Please consider permitting us to remove this particular tree to help create a safer space for children and pets, cut down on costly structure repairs and insecticide spraying, and better utilize the full potential of our property. We would like to have this particular tree removed and would love to plant some sort of fruit trees in its place, something with an underground root system for that area.
