- Truman Waterfront Park Re-scheduled for October 6th Power point presentation for the City Commission meeting with Alison Higgins to receive "acceptance" of the Civic Moxie finished Master Arts & Culture plan for the park.
- Truman Waterfront Park The Florida Keys Sculpture Trail now begins and ends in the Park. The artwork, "Wave Henge" by artists Damon Hamm and Jeff Sundheim was installed on September 13-14th by R.V.W. Sculpture Installation, Inc and coordinated by Liz and City Community services and Engineering departments. Toppino's and Bella Construction completed the concrete pad (paid with AIPP funds \$12,000).
- 1400 Duval Park/Mall 5 sculptures scheduled for installation on October 6th Tim Root is assisting Liz and the artists. Insurance/artist waivers under review by Legal dept. Also working with the City for new signage.
- KW Seaport Public Art project RFP has been approved and final edits completed by Administrator. Need to determine best release and due date – has been paused due to Covid-19. Do not have a release date yet but hope to have it soon.
