Project received major development plan approval in January 2019. Demolition, Staging, and Building permits were issued starting in April 2019 primarily to Marino Construction Group and Charley Toppino and Sons Inc. Marino Construction is accepting responsibility of the tree issues on the site.

Two Gumbo Limbos trees (#56 and #102) were not properly protected during demolition and construction of the site causing irreputable damage to both trees. On Gumbo Limbo was to be remain in place but was instead moved and the other was not transplanted properly.








In April 2020 the two Gumbo Limbo trees were declared dead and removed from the site. The contractor did plant the full replacements of the trees on the property and the landscape plan was revised to include additional Gumbo limbo tree plantings.

Recommend a fine be issued against the contractor for the irreputable damage done to the two Gumbo limbo trees due to the lack of required tree protection and improper transplanting mesures.
