On 08/20/2020, at about 1359 hours, Ofc. F. Betz, Ofc. T. Stevens, and I (Ofc. T. Beeman) responded to the area of 1114 Olivia Street in reference to a report of a male subject who was naked in the roadway.

Ofc. F. Betz arrived first on scene and advised that he was out with the male subject (Eric Stevenson, DOB 04/01/1970) on Pohalski Lane. Ofc. F. Betz then stated that Stevenson was heading towards Truman Avenue from Pohalski Lane.

I diverted from Olivia Street to Truman Avenue, in an attempt to cut Stevenson off from the busy roadway. As I arrived near the intersection of Truman Avenue and Grinnell Street, Ofc. F. Betz advised that he had Stevenson detained.

Upon arriving on Pohalski Lane, I could see Ofc. F. Betz with Stevenson on the ground in the middle of the lane. Stevenson was completely nude, sweating profusely, had pin-pointed pupils, was disoriented, and not able to speak; indicating that he may be under the influence of an illicit substance and/or in a state of excited delirium. Ofc. F. Betz stated that he had no choice but to handcuff Stevenson in the front and lay him on the ground prior to my arrival. Due to the extreme heat of the asphalt, we relocated Stevenson to a shady area several feet away, in the parking lot behind the Seam Shoppe (1113 Truman Avenue).

Once in the shady area, we attempted to get Stevenson back to the ground but were unsuccessful, due to him thrashing his body about. Sgt. M. Siracuse arrived on scene and assisted in getting Stevenson to the ground. Once on the ground, I placed Stevenson in a "figure four" leg lock to prevent him from getting up, while keeping all pressure off of his upper body. Sgt. M. Siracuse assisted in applying a Hobble restraint to Stevenson's legs to prepare for transport.

Ofc. T. Stevens arrived on scene and assisted in switching Stevenson's handcuffs from the front to the back. Rescue arrived on scene and transported Stevenson to Lower Keys Medical Center.

Ofc. F. Betz rode in the ambulance with Stevenson, while I followed behind (In-car video activated).

Stevenson was released into the care of Lower Keys Medical Center.

I uploaded all in-car and BWC footage to COBAN and AXON.

This concludes my involvement in this case.
