On October 31st, 2020, I, Ofc. Waite, was dispatched to Rick's Bar located at 202 Duval Street as back up for Ofc. Howell who was conducting a criminal mischief investigation and Ofc. Bozzetti who was conducting a drug investigation. Sgt. Vazquez and Ofc. Ham were on scene assisting Ofc. Howell and Ofc. Bozzetti with their investigations. During the investigations, I held scene security as we were dealing with two separate cases in front of a large Friday night crowd in the most heavily trafficked area of Duval Street.

As I held scene security, an emotional male subject, identified later as Aidan McNaughton, approached me and advised his twin brother, identified later as Benjamin McNaughton, had been placed into handcuffs and was currently in the rear of Ofc. Howell's patrol vehicle. Aidan appeared to be intoxicated, i.e., bloodshot glassy eyes, thick slurred speech, and the odor of an alcoholic beverage emanated from his breath as he spoke. I explained to Aidan that his brother was under arrest for criminal mischief and asked that he back away from the area in which the Officers were conducting their investigations. Aidan complied and walked away. Moments later, Aidan began shouting loudly that his brother had been arrested and began arguing with a group of male subjects as they attempted to calm him. I approached Aidan and instructed him to calm down. I explained to Aidan that if he began causing a disturbance he could be placed under arrest as well.

Once the investigation was complete, I left the area and began driving to the station to drop off evidence. While enroute, Sgt. Vazquez asked for backup at the Wendy's on Duval Street in reference to an intoxicated male, Aidan McNaughton, displaying his middle finger at Sgt. Vazquez and passersby. Sgt. Vazquez later told me several passersby observed Aidan's disorderly behavior and appeared to be concerned. Sgt. Vazquez was also notified by passersby by that Aidan had attempted to fight several subjects as he walked south on Duval Street from Rick's Bar towards the Wendy's. Sgt. Vazquez advised that as he parked his patrol vehicle, Aidan ran inside the Wendy's and locked himself inside of the restroom. Sgt Vazquez stated Aidan returned outside shortly after at which point Sgt. Vazquez instructed him to have a seat. Sgt. Vazquez said Aidan became verbally resistant. Sgt. Vazquez removed his department issued OC spray and told Aidan he would be sprayed if he did not comply. Aidan complied and took a seat on the curb. Once seated, Sgt. Vazquez placed handcuff restraints around his wrist.

As I arrived on scene, a male and female, identified later as Jack Danhart and Isabela Palicki, approached Sgt. Vazquez and I and began demanding that we tell them why Aidan was in handcuffs. Because Aidan's behavior had drawn a large crowd of spectators and Sgt. Vazquez and I were alone awaiting back up, I instructed Danhart and Palicki to step back and away from Sgt. Vazquez and I. Palicki continued berating Sgt. Vazquez and I, demanding that we give her an explanation as to why Aidan was in handcuffs. As I was speaking to Danhart and Palicki, Sgt. Vazquez was approached by another male subject, Colin Bourgeois. Bourgeois appeared to be a friend of Aidan's and was told several times by Sergeant Vazquez to step away from our immediate area. Bourgeois called Sgt. Vazquez a pussy and continuously defied Sgt. Vazquez's commands to step back and away from our investigation. Unbeknownst to me, Ofc. Purcell arrived on scene and Sgt. Vazquez instructed him to place Bourgeois into handcuffs reference

resisting. As. Ofc. Purcell attempted to take Bourgeois into custody, Bourgeois shoved Ofc. Purcell away from him and fled on foot traveling east on Eaton Street directly towards K9 Ofc. Anglin, who was arriving on scene. Ofc. Purcell and I began pursuing Bourgeois as K9 Ofc. Anglin issued Bourgeois loud verbal commands to stop running. In full sprint, Bourgeois tucked his shoulder and attempted to run through K9 Ofc. Anglin as he barreled into him. K9 Ofc. Anglin grabbed a hold of Bourgeois, at which point Ofc. Purcell utilized a hip toss takedown maneuver redirecting Bourgeois to the ground in a controlled manner. Ofc. Purcell used the maneuver in order to limit Bourgeois' physical resistance and to apply handcuff restraints on to his wrist. Bourgeois, who was face down on the sidewalk, continued to actively resist Ofc. Purcell, K9 Ofc. Anglin, and I as we attempted to place him into handcuffs by tucking his arms underneath his chest in an attempt to defeat our attempts of control. I unholstered my Taser, removed the cartridge, and began drive-stunning Bourgeois in the upper right quadrant of his back while issuing him loud verbal commands to place his hands behind his back. Bourgeois did not immediately comply, causing me to issue several cycles through the Taser to gain compliance. While struggling with Bourgeois, I heard Sgt. Vazquez state over the radio that he had deployed his OC Spray on several subjects and was requesting additional units to expedite their response to his location. Once Bourgeois was in handcuffs, I returned to the intersection of Eaton Street and Duval Street to assist Sgt. Vazquez.

As I approached the Wendy's, I observed Sgt. Vazquez who was on the ground and in the middle of the roadway on top of Aidan. In front of the Wendy's, I observed Danhart and Palicki as they sat in front of the restaurant complaining of pain from the OC spray. Ofc. Ham monitored Danhart and I monitored Palicki as we waited for additional units. Ofc. Malak and Sgt. Kouri arrived on scene and were able to provide me with a set of handcuff restraints to place on Palicki.

Once the scene was secure, I spoke with Sgt. Vazquez. Sgt Vazquez told me when Bourgeois fled, he attempted to place Aiden into the rear of his nearby patrol vehicle. While crossing Eaton Street, Sgt. Vazquez stated McNaughton pushed off of him and attempted to flee. Sgt. Vazquez said he performed a modified takedown on McNaughton, taking him to the ground in a controlled manner. As Sgt. Vazquez had McNaughton pinned to the ground awaiting additional units, Danhart and Palicki suddenly and aggressively approached Sgt. Vazquez. Sgt. Vazquez issued Danhart and Palicki loud verbal commands to back up. Danhart and Palicki physically and verbally refused to comply to Sgt. Vazquez's commands, at which point he deployed two short bursts from his department issued OC cannister striking Danhart and Palicki in the face.

Key West Fire Department Rescue 2 was dispatched to the scene in order to evaluate Bourgeois, Danhart, and Palicki. Rescue 2 assisted in decontaminating the OC spray from Danhart and Palicki's faces, and cleared the scene shortly after.

After being evaluated, Bourgeois and Danhart were placed into the rear of Ofc. Purcell's patrol vehicle and transported to the Monroe County Detention Center without incident. Aiden and Janicki were

placed into the rear of my patrol vehicle and were also transported to the Monroe County Detention Center without incident.

My BWC was activated throughout this call and will be uploaded into evidence.

Based on the facts and evidence, Aiden Tarrant McNaughton did commits such acts as are of a nature to corrupt the public morals, outrage the sense of public decency, affect the peace and quiet of persons who may witness them, and engages in such conduct as to constitute a breach of the peace or disorderly conduct contrary to F.S. 877.03 - Breach of the peace; disorderly conduct.

Aiden Tarrant McNaughton did also resist and oppose Sgt. Vazquez, a certified Law Enforcement Officer in the State of Florida, during the lawful execution of his legal duties by attempting to flee from Sgt. Vazquez while under arrest, in handcuffs, and being escorted to the rear of a marked patrol vehicle contrary to F.S. 843.02 - Resisting officer without violence to his or her person.

At the jail, Bourgeois provided me with his name and date of birth, June 18, 2000. While turning his belongings over to the Detention Deputies I located a Connecticut Driver License inside of Bourgeois' wallet. The identification matched the information Bourgeois had provided to me but listed his year of birth as 1998. I asked Bourgeois to confirm his year of birth and he advised 2000. I attempted to run the License through the National Crime Information Center and did not receive a return, indicative of a counterfeit identification card. I seized the counterfeit Driver License and will be placing it into property as evidence.

While searching Bourgeois' wallet, Detention Center Deputies located a clear plastic bag containing a white powdery substance. Officer Purcell conducted a field test on the white powdery substance, and it field tested positive for cocaine. Ofc. Purcell weighed (0.3 grams), packaged, and submitted the cocaine into property as evidence. The Detention Center Deputies also located a small clear baggie containing one small round blue pill labled 031 on one side and R on the other side. Using the online website Drugs.com, Ofc. Purcell identified the pill as Alprazolam 1mg a schedule 4 controlled substance. The bag also contained a green rectangle-like and two broken pieces of the same green rectangle-like pill inside of the bag. The pills were labled S 90 3 on one side. Ofc. Purcell identified the pills as Alprazolam 2mg. The total weight for this Alprazolam was .9 grams.

My BWC was activated throughout this call and will be uploaded into evidence.

Based on the facts and evidence, Colin R Bourgeois did actually and intentionally strike Officer Purcell, a certified Law Enforcement Officer in The State ff Florida against his will contrary to F.S. 784.07 - Assault or battery of law enforcement officers. It should be noted that during this incident Ofc. Purcell was wearing his department issued Class B uniform, badge, and full duty belt.

Based on the facts and evidence, Colin R Bourgeois did knowingly and willfully resist obstruct and oppose myself, Sgt. Vazquez, Ofc. Purcell, K9 Ofc. Anglin, all certified Law Enforcement Officer's in the State of Florida, during the lawful execution of our legal duties Colin R Bourgeois did knowingly and intentionally charge at and attempt to run through K9 Ofc. Anglin as fled from arrest contrary to F.S. 843.01 - Resisting officer with violence to his or her person.

Based on the facts and evidence, Colin R Bourgeois did knowingly have in his possession an unlawfully issued fictitious Conneticut state Driver License contrary to F.S. 322.12 (1) (A) - Unauthorized possession of, and other unlawful acts in relation to, driver license or identification card.

Based on the facts and evidence, Colin R Bourgeois was in possession of 0.3 grams of a white powdery substance which field tested positive for cocaine contrary to F.S. 893.13 6a – Possession of a Controlled Substance.

Based on the facts and evidence, Colin R Bourgeois was in possession of 0.3 grams of Alprazolam 1mg, a schedule 4 controlled substance, contrary to F.S. 893.13 6a – Possession of a Controlled Substance.

Based on the facts and evidence, Colin R Bourgeois was in possession of 0.9 grams of Alprazolam 2mg, a schedule 4 controlled substance, contrary to F.S. 893.13 6a – Possession of a Controlled Substance.

On October 31st, 2020, I, Ofc. Waite, was dispatched to Rick's Bar located at 202 Duval Street as back up for Ofc. Howell who was conducting a criminal mischief investigation and Ofc. Bozzetti who was conducting a drug investigation. Sgt. Vazquez and Ofc. Ham were on scene assisting Ofc. Howell and Ofc. Bozzetti with their investigations. During the investigations, I held scene security as we were dealing with two separate cases in front of a large Friday night crowd in the most heavily trafficked area of Duval Street.

As I held scene security, an emotional male subject, identified later as Aidan McNaughton, approached me and advised his twin brother, identified later as Benjamin McNaughton, had been placed into handcuffs and was currently in the rear of Ofc. Howell's patrol vehicle. Aidan appeared to be intoxicated, i.e., bloodshot glassy eyes, thick slurred speech, and the odor of an alcoholic beverage emanated from his breath as he spoke. I explained to Aidan that his brother was under arrest for criminal mischief and asked that he back away from the area in which the Officers were conducting their investigations. Aidan complied and walked away. Moments later, Aidan began shouting loudly that his brother had been arrested and began arguing with a group of male subjects as they attempted to calm him. I approached Aidan and instructed him to calm down. I explained to Aidan that if he began causing a disturbance he could be placed under arrest as well.

Once the investigation was complete, I left the area and began driving to the station to drop off evidence. While enroute, Sgt. Vazquez asked for backup at the Wendy's on Duval Street in reference to an intoxicated male, Aidan McNaughton, displaying his middle finger at Sgt. Vazquez and passersby. Sgt. Vazquez later told me several passersby observed Aidan's disorderly behavior and appeared to be concerned. Sgt. Vazquez was also notified by passersby by that Aidan had attempted to fight several subjects as he walked south on Duval Street from Rick's Bar towards the Wendy's. Sgt. Vazquez advised that as he parked his patrol vehicle, Aidan ran inside the Wendy's and locked himself inside of the restroom. Sgt Vazquez stated Aidan returned outside shortly after at which point Sgt. Vazquez instructed him to have a seat. Sgt. Vazquez said Aidan became verbally resistant. Sgt. Vazquez removed his department issued OC spray and told Aidan he would be sprayed if he did not comply. Aidan complied and took a seat on the curb. Once seated, Sgt. Vazquez placed handcuff restraints around his wrist.

As I arrived on scene, a male and female, identified later as Jack Danhart and Isabela Palicki, approached Sgt. Vazquez and I and began demanding that we tell them why Aidan was in handcuffs. Because Aidan's behavior had drawn a large crowd of spectators and Sgt. Vazquez and I were alone awaiting back up, I instructed Danhart and Palicki to step back and away from Sgt. Vazquez and I. Palicki continued berating Sgt. Vazquez and I, demanding that we give her an explanation as to why Aidan was in handcuffs. As I was speaking to Danhart and Palicki, Sgt. Vazquez was approached by another male subject, Colin Bourgeois. Bourgeois appeared to be a friend of Aidan's and was told several times by Sergeant Vazquez to step away from our immediate area. Bourgeois called Sgt. Vazquez a pussy and continuously defied Sgt. Vazquez's commands to step back and away from our investigation. Unbeknownst to me, Ofc. Purcell arrived on scene and Sgt. Vazquez instructed him to place Bourgeois into handcuffs reference

resisting. As. Ofc. Purcell attempted to take Bourgeois into custody, Bourgeois shoved Ofc. Purcell away from him and fled on foot traveling east on Eaton Street directly towards K9 Ofc. Anglin, who was arriving on scene. Ofc. Purcell and I began pursuing Bourgeois as K9 Ofc. Anglin issued Bourgeois loud verbal commands to stop running. In full sprint, Bourgeois tucked his shoulder and attempted to run through K9 Ofc. Anglin as he barreled into him. K9 Ofc. Anglin grabbed a hold of Bourgeois, at which point Ofc. Purcell utilized a hip toss takedown maneuver redirecting Bourgeois to the ground in a controlled manner. Ofc. Purcell used the maneuver in order to limit Bourgeois' physical resistance and to apply handcuff restraints on to his wrist. Bourgeois, who was face down on the sidewalk, continued to actively resist Ofc. Purcell, K9 Ofc. Anglin, and I as we attempted to place him into handcuffs by tucking his arms underneath his chest in an attempt to defeat our attempts of control. I unhoistered my Taser, removed the cartridge, and began drive-stunning Bourgeois in the upper right quadrant of his back while issuing him loud verbal commands to place his hands behind his back. Bourgeois did not immediately comply, causing me to issue several cycles through the Taser to gain compliance. While struggling with Bourgeois, I heard Sgt. Vazquez state over the radio that he had deployed his OC Spray on several subjects and was requesting additional units to expedite their response to his location. Once Bourgeois was in handcuffs, I returned to the intersection of Eaton Street and Duval Street to assist Sgt. Vazquez.

As I approached the Wendy's, I observed Sgt. Vazquez who was on the ground and in the middle of the roadway on top of Aidan. In front of the Wendy's, I observed Danhart and Palicki as they sat in front of the restaurant complaining of pain from the OC spray. Ofc. Ham monitored Danhart and I monitored Palicki as we waited for additional units. Ofc. Malak and Sgt. Kouri arrived on scene and were able to provide me with a set of handcuff restraints to place on Palicki.

Once the scene was secure, I spoke with Sgt. Vazquez. Sgt Vazquez told me when Bourgeois fled, he attempted to place Aiden into the rear of his nearby patrol vehicle. While crossing Eaton Street, Sgt. Vazquez stated McNaughton pushed off of him and attempted to flee. Sgt. Vazquez said he performed a modified takedown on McNaughton, taking him to the ground in a controlled manner. As Sgt. Vazquez had McNaughton pinned to the ground awaiting additional units, Danhart and Palicki suddenly and aggressively approached Sgt. Vazquez. Sgt. Vazquez issued Danhart and Palicki loud verbal commands to back up. Danhart and Palicki physically and verbally refused to comply to Sgt. Vazquez's commands, at which point he deployed two short bursts from his department issued OC cannister striking Danhart and Palicki in the face.

Vazquez instructed him to place Bourgeois into handcuffs reference

I unhoistered my Taser, removed the cartridge, and began drive-stunning Bourgeois in the upper right quadrant of his back while issuing him loud verbal commands to place his hands behind his back. Bourgeois did not immediately comply, causing me to issue several cycles through the Taser to gain compliance. While struggling with Bourgeois, I heard Sgt. Vazquez state over the radio that he had deployed his OC Spray on several subjects and was requesting additional units to expedite their response to his location. Once Bourgeois was in handcuffs, I returned to the intersection of Eaton Street and Duval Street to assist Sgt. Vazquez.

As I approached the Wendy's, I observed Sgt. Vazquez who was on the ground and in the middle of the roadway on top of Aidan. In front of the Wendy's, I observed Danhart and Palicki as they sat in front of the restaurant complaining of pain from the OC spray. Ofc. Ham monitored Danhart and I monitored Palicki as we waited for additional units. Ofc. Malak and Sgt. Kouri arrived on scene and were able to provide me with a set of handcuff restraints to place on Palicki.

Once the scene was secure, I spoke with Sgt. Vazquez. Sgt Vazquez told me when Bourgeois fled, he attempted to place Aiden into the rear of his nearby patrol vehicle. While crossing Eaton Street, Sgt. Vazquez stated McNaughton pushed off of him and attempted to flee. Sgt. Vazquez said he performed a modified takedown on McNaughton, taking him to the ground in a controlled manner. As Sgt. Vazquez had McNaughton pinned to the ground awaiting additional units, Danhart and Palicki suddenly and aggressively approached Sgt. Vazquez. Sgt. Vazquez issued Danhart and Palicki loud verbal commands to back up. Danhart and Palicki physically and verbally refused to comply to Sgt. Vazquez's commands, at which point he deployed two short bursts from his department issued OC cannister striking Danhart and Palicki in the face.

Key West Fire Department Rescue 2 was dispatched to the scene in order to evaluate Bourgeois, Danhart, and Palicki. Rescue 2 assisted in decontaminating the OC spray from Danhart and Palicki's faces, and cleared the scene shortly after.

After being evaluated, Bourgeois and Danhart were placed into the rear of Ofc. Purcell's patrol vehicle and transported to the Monroe County Detention Center without incident. Aiden and Janicki were

placed into the rear of my patrol vehicle and were also transported to the Monroe County Detention Center without incident.

At the jail, Danhart provided me with his name and date of birth, November 18, 1999. While turning his belongings over to the Detention Deputies I located a Texas Driver License inside of Danhart's wallet. The identification matched the information Danhart had provided to me but listed his year of birth as 1996. I asked Danhart to confirm his year of birth and he advised 1999. I attempted to run the License through the National Crime Information Center and did not receive a return, indicative of a counterfeit identification card. I seized the counterfeit Driver License and will be placing it into property as evidence.

My BWC was activated throughout this call and will be uploaded into evidence.

Based on the facts and evidence, Jack Peter Danhart did resist obstruct and oppose Sgt. Vazquez, a certified Law Enforcement Officer in the State of Florida, during the lawful execution of his legal duties by continuously interfering with Sgt. Vazquez as he conducted a disorderly conduct investigation and as he attempted to secure an arrestee, a friend of Denhart's, into the rear of his patrol vehicle contrary to F.S. 843.02 - Resisting officer without violence to his or her person.

Jack Peter Danhart did knowingly have in his possession an unlawfully issued fictitious Texas state Driver License contrary to F.S. 322.12 (1) (A) - Unauthorized possession of, and other unlawful acts in relation to, driver license or identification card.

On October 30th, 2020, at about 2340 hours, I Sgt. Vazquez was approaching the intersection, of Eaton St., and Duval St, when I observed a subject screaming multiple obscenities. The subject was displaying his middle finger at me, as well as pedestrians and other citizens in the immediate area. As I parked my marked patrol car, I observed numerous concerned citizens having their normal sense of public decency, peace and quiet, normal expectations of public morals being affected by the disorderly actions and conduct of this subject. I parked my patrol car on the 500 block of Eaton Street, while continuing to maintain visual contact on the male. The male ran into Wendy's and locked himself in the bathroom. I waited outside. I radioed for more units to respond, due to a growing crowd. A few moments later, the male exited the restaurant.

It should be noted that moments prior to this, the unknown male was interfering with Officers and myself on an unrelated call at 202 Duval Street. It was also reported that the unknown male attempted to fight multiple subjects. This subject's belligerent behavior progressed as he walked south on Duval St. The unknown male was removed from numerous establishments, around the lower Duval corridor.

I made contact with the male and told him to have a seat. The male became verbally resistant at first. I removed my department issued OC spray and told him he would be sprayed if he did not comply. The male eventually complied and had a seat on an adjacent curb. I handcuffed the subject. The subject was later identified as Adrian Tarrant Mcnaughton.

While speaking with Mcnaughton, a few of his friends arrived and began to impede my investigation. Jack Peter Danhart, and Isabella Sofia Palicki specifically drew my attention to them and hindered my investigation. I gave loud verbal commands for Danhart and Palicki to back up, however they refused. I had to physically push both Palicki and Danhart back. At one point I lost visual on Mcnaughton due to their impeding of my investigation. A third friend of Mcnaughton walked up. I also gave him loud verbal commands for him to back up, he also refused and called me a "Pussy". I instructed Ofc. Purcell, who was walking up, to place this subject in custody. The subject pushed off of Ofc. Purcell and suddenly took flight, running east on Eaton Street. I stayed with Mcnaughton, while Ofc. Purcell and Ofc. Anglin fought with the unknown male. Given the fact the scene was rapidly deteriorating, I began to escort Mcnaughton to my nearby patrol car. As we were crossing Eaton Street, Mcnaughton suddenly pushed off of me and attempted to run. Given these facts, and Mcnaughton resistance level rising, I performed a modified takedown, bringing Mcnaughton to the ground in a controlled manner. Once on the ground Mcnaughton, stopped physically resisting. While on the ground, Danhart and Palicki suddenly and aggressively ran up. I gave numerous, loud, clear, verbal commands for Danhart and Palicki to back up. They ignored my commands and remained within just a few feet of Mcnaughton and myself. Given the fact Danhart and Palicki, physically and verbally were refusing to comply, I deployed two short bursts of my department issued OC spray, striking Danhart and Palicki in their face's. Danhart and Palicki began to run away in opposite directions. I radioed to responding units to expedite. Once other officers arrived on scene, we placed Mcnaughton on an adjacent curb.

A few moments, I attempted to place Danhart in custody. Danhart became physically resistant by refusing to put his hands behind his back. Ofc. Ham was giving loud verbal commands for Danhart to stop resisting. I used a modified takedown to bring Danhart to the ground in a controlled manner. Once on the ground, Danhart continued to physically resist my efforts in placing him in custody. I removed my dept issued Taser and delivered a cartridge off drive stun to Danhart's middle back. Danhart immediately put his hands behind his back. Ofc. Ham handcuffed Danhart.

I had no further interactions with the defendants in this case.

My BWC was activated.

On October 30, 2020, at approximately 2344 hours, I, Ofc. S. Ham responded to 335 Duval St., as backup.

Upon arrival, Sgt. B. Vazquez was on the ground with one male and he told me to stand by the other male that had been pepper sprayed. I stood by the other male that was seated on the sidewalk. I had to tell the male multiple times to stay seated. Sgt. Vazquez walked over to me and said to arrest the male. I grabbed the male by his left wrist, and he began pulling away from me and Sgt. Vazquez. Sgt. Vazquez rolled the male on to his front side while I maintained control over his left wrist. The male would not allow us to bring his hands behind his back to handcuff him. Sgt. Vazquez drive stunned the male between his shoulder blades. I handcuffed the male and Ofc. T. Malak and I sat him up. Ofc. Malak escorted the male to the side of Wendy's, and I escorted the other male that Sgt. Vazquez was previously with to the same location.

This concluded my interaction with this case.

On 10/30/2020 at approximately 2347 hours I, Officer Purcell, responded to 335a Duval St (Wendy's) to back up Sgt Vazquez with a disorderly subject.

Upon arrival I observed a white male (Colin Bourgeois) standing next to Sgt Vazquez. Sgt Vazquez was giving Bourgeois verbal commands to back away. Sgt Vazquez instructed me to detain Bourgeois. Bourgeois pushed away from me and began to run east on Eaton St. I drew my taser and gave Bourgeois verbal commands to stop or he would be tased. Officer T. Anglin intercepted Bourgeois approximately 40 feet east from the intersection of Duval St and Eaton St. Bourgeois lowered his shoulder and attempted to run through Officer T. Anglin. Officer T. Anglin grabbed Bourgeois and stopped his forward progress. I grabbed Bourgeois around the waist and picked him up and put him on the ground. Bourgeois pulled his hands under his body and tensed attempting to prevent being placed in handcuffs. I gave Bourgeois clear verbal commands to place his hands behind his back. Bourgeois did not comply. Officer T. Anglin and I were able to force Bourgeois' left arm behind his back. Officer Waite drive stunned Bourgeois several times before he complied and put his right arm behind his back. I placed handcuffs on Bourgeois and searched his person. During the search I located a wallet in Bourgeois' left front pants pocket. Inside the wallet was one Img Alprazolam pill, one and two partial 2mg Alprazolam tabs, and a small baggie containing .3g of FTP cocaine.

I transported Bourgeois and Jack Denhart to the Monroe County Detention Center without incident.

My Axon BWC was activated but was immediately knocked off of my person when Bourgeois pushed away from me and ran.

On 30OCT20 at 2341, I (Ofc. T. Anglin) responded to Wendy's, located at 335a Duval Street regarding a request for assistance by Sgt. B. VAZQUEZ for an unruly subject on scene. Upon my arrival to the area, (500 block of Eaton Street) I headed towards the Duval Street side of the restaurant.

As I rounded the backside of a parked vehicle and stepped onto the sidewalk, I heard Officers, who were standing near the entrance of the restaurant on Duval Street, giving commands to a white male wearing a dark colored sleeveless shirt and dark colored shorts to stop.

I observed the white male flail his arms at the Officers and begin running east on the 500 block of Eaton Street on the sidewalk towards me. I was wearing my KWPD K-9 uniform and yelled for the white male to stop. As the white male closed the distance between us, he suddenly shifted his stance like a football player and attempted to run through me. I blocked the white male's path and attempted to gain control of his arms and redirect his forward momentum towards the ground.

I stopped the white male as his body spun around and he tumbled to the ground as I regained my now unstable footing. The white male quickly regained his footing and as he attempted to stand and flee once more, Ofc. C. PURCELL quickly approached and was able to redirect the white male to the ground, (See Ofc. C. PURCELL'S report for details).

Once on the ground, the white male braced his arms underneath his body and refused to be handcuffed. Ofc. PURCELL and I were able to gain control of the white male's left arm and Ofc. C. PURCELL placed a handcuff on his right wrist. Ofc. K. WAITE utilized his Taser, (Drive stun – no cartridge for pain compliance) on the white male's right triceps, which allowed me the opportunity to gain control of his right arm. Ofc. C. PURCELL was able to place the second handcuff on the white male's right wrist.

After the white male was handcuffed, Ofc. C. PURCELL and I escorted the white male to Ofc. C. PURCELL'S patrol vehicle and secured him inside. After speaking with Officers on scene and collecting my equipment to include my body camera, which was knocked to the ground during the incident, I gathered information for my report and departed the scene.

My Axon body worn camera was not active during this incident and was knocked off my body during the onset of my involvement in this call.

On 10/30/20 at 2043hrs, I, Officer Malak responded to 335 Duval St, as a back up unit to a physical problem.

While in route to the call, Sgt Vazquez requested incoming unit to expedite to his location. I activated my overhead emergency blue lights and proceed to the 335 Duval St location.

Upon arrival, I observed Sgt Vazquez and Officer Ham attempting to handcuff a male subject, later identified as Jack Denhart DOB 11/18/99. Denhart was on the ground and actively resisting by pulling his arms away from officers. Due to the active resisting, Sgt Vazquez deployed his Taser, using a drive stun tactic. Using my training in Defensive Tactics, I grabbed Denhart in a Wrist Lock and he was properly handcuffed by Officer Ham. Once handcuffed, I assisted Denhart to a nearby staircase, where he was seen by Key West Fire Department for medical clearance.

Once the incident was over with Denhart, I also assisted another male subject, identified as Aiden McNaughton, to the same staircase as Denhart. Both subjects were cleared by KWFD for their exposures to OC spray.

Once everyone was secured, I remained on location and assisted with gathering statements and placing the individuals into Patrol Vehicles.

My BWC was active for this incident, with nothing further.
