Discussion topics:

Group 1 Focus area: Bahama Village 3.2 acre site. The 3.2 Bahama Village site must benefit the Bahama Village community. Shall the emphasis be focused solely on housing or should it have a component designed to maximize revenue for the Bahama Village Redevelopment Area/TIF fund? What types of economic development, small business incubation, and/or education programs could be leveraged with new revenue? How important is the streetscape?

Group 2 Focus area: Accessory dwelling unit benefits and drawbacks. Could the City help address housing needs through streamlining the construction and approval process for accessory dwelling units? How do we ensure these units are designed in harmony with our neighborhoods?

Group 3 Focus area: Incentivizing innovative shopping center redevelopment with affordable housing. The City's major shopping centers are aging and flood conditions are changing. How might the City and community further incentivize mixed use shopping center redevelopment to incorporate innovative designs and some affordable housing?
