FY22 Budget includes 50/50 Energy Manager/Adaptation staff and 10 Year Energy Plan.

- 1) Change all Street Lights to LEDs
 - Have \$100K in FY22 Budget for Phase 1.
 - Preliminary partnership talks with KES involve them surplusing remaining non-LED bulbs, purchasing necessary replacement bulbs and City paying for labor. Estimates provided, need to draw up potential plans.
- 2) Partner with Keys Energy to develop an energy plan
 - Have asked KES to partner with us on Street Lighting to meet their Sustainability Goals.
- 3) KES will be held 2 EV workshops in May 18 and June 8
 - May 18: Good basic info on different models.
 - June 8: KES doesn't want to lead, but recognizes they will be affected and need to prepare.
