-- Scott Kopp Arrest Narrative:

On 08/27/2021 at 0747 hours I, (Ofc. J. Tellier) was dispatched to 800 Caroline Street Upstairs in reference to a verbal argument. The caller stated there was a man in her apartment throwing things and looking for a woman named Michelle.

Upon my arrival, Ofc. T. Calvert was also on scene. We got out of our patrol cars and saw a pile of personal property laying on the sidewalk in front of 800 Caroline. It was mostly clothing, some paperwork, and a white deck chair that had been smashed. When we looked up, we saw Scott Kopp (NJ DL) standing on the balcony, shirtless.

We walked up the stairs and made contact with Kopp. His eyes were bloodshot, he was swaying when he stood still.

I asked him if the property on the sidewalk belonged to him and he said yes. I asked him why he threw his property onto the sidewalk, where it could injure someone, and he didn't have a reason.

At this point Ofc. T. Calvert walked away looking for the reporting person.

I tried to build some kind of rapport with Kopp, asking him how he was doing, but he didn't really answer. I asked him for his photo ID. He handed me a New Jersey license from his wallet. His wallet was brown with cash in it. He set it on the railing. I stepped away from Kopp to run his information on channel 2. Kopp's wallet was still sitting on the railing so I handed it to him, so it wouldn't wind up missing. He snatched the wallet from my hand and threw it over the railing. While I was running his information, Kopp sat down in a white deck chair underneath an air conditioning unit. The drip pan from the air conditioner broke, dumping water onto Kopp's head. He ripped what was left of the drip pan off the wall, and threw it over the railing onto the sidewalk. Then he picked up a full length mirror and threw it over the railing onto the sidewalk. At this point I detained Kopp with handcuffs, eliminating his ability to throw anything else over the railing, and preventing further damage or injury.

I escorted Kopp over to my patrol car and placed him in the back seat without incident. I turned on my incar Axon system, but accidentily selected the front camera instead of the rear seat camera. While searching Kopp's pockets, I found a set of keys. WHile placing them in my trunk I heard a thump. It sounded as if Kopp was banging his body or head into something. I opened the rear door to check on him. I advised him that I was going to belt him in so he didn't injure himself. He stated he did not want to be restrained and that he wanted to speak to a supervisor. I explained to him that seatbelting is a department policy that is followed when transporting handcuffed people in a patrol car. At the same time he stuck his right leg out of my car and tensed it, preventing me from closing the door. I tried to pick his leg up, but he was still tensed. I advised Kopp that I was going to use a taser on him if he did not comply, and still he remained tensed. I unholstered my taser and placed the cartridge on the roof of my car. Seeing the taser, Kopp quickly put his leg back inside the patrol car. As soon as I holstered the taser his leg came back out and still tensed. I advised Kopp that I was going to tase him. He stated "Tase me" several times. I cartridge off drive stunned Kopp in his right thigh. When the connection was made, Kopp screamed and backed into the patrol car. I belted Kopp in with assistance from Ofc. T. Calvert.

Ofc. T. Stevens responded to the scene, and watched over Kopp so I could conduct my investigation.

I walked back up the stairs to meet with Jack and Jilliane Anderson. During our conversation they stated the following.

The Anderson's own the building and are renting out the front room to Kopp. The downstairs of the building is store front, and there are three units upstairs. The Anderson's live in one unit. The second unit is Jack's office. And the third unit is rented to Kopp as an apartment.

On this date, Kopp came barging into unit one (the Anderson's home). He walked into the unit and began throwing items around, and tried to get upstairs. Lilliane had to convince him to leave and walk back down the stairs. Kopp stated he was searching for guns and a woman named Michelle. Kopp grabbed a pair of Jack's shoes and threw them over the balcony onto the sidewalk.

Kopp then proceeded in attemping to break into Jack's office next door, grabbing at the handle, kicking and hitting the door. The two men got into an argument and Kopp finally walked away. Lilliane called the police right after.

I searched the property for damage or theft with Lilliane. She stated all the items that were knocked over in her home were put back on the shelves. The Anderson's had numerous spear guns in the front area of their home, but all were accounted for. The door to Jack's office was intact but had scuff marks on it, indicating it had been kicked at some point.

Kopp's apartment was turned upside down. The contents from the fridge were on the floor, with ice melting on a hardwood floor. The contents of the medicine cabinet were in the toilet. The dryer vent was laying on the floor by the front door. The kitchen table was on it's side. There was not one area in the apartment, that had not been damaged or turned up. The apartment looked as if someone ransacked it.

Lilliane stated the mirror and the deck chair (smashed on the sidewalk below) were her property and provided to Kopp.

At the time of this report it is unclear how much damage Kopp did inside the apartment. Lilliane stated the thawing ice cubes would possibly damage the hardwood floors.

I walked back over to my patrol car. Ofc. T. Stevens advised me that Kopp unbuckled himself in the backseat. Kopp stuck his leg out and made it tense again, refusing to comply with simple instructions to put his leg back in. Even with Sgt. Duponty trying to reason with Kopp had no effect. I deployed my taser a second time with a cartridge off drive stun, to Kopp's right thigh again. He screamed and backed himself into the seat, but still had his legs stiff and tensed. At this point I requested an ambulance for Kopp.

When the ambulance responded, Kopp was removed from my patrol car. He refused to sit on the sidewalk so his blood pressure could be checked. He was complaining of chest pains and a shortness of breath. Three pill bottles were recovered from Kopp's apartment. The medication was for erectile dysfunction and high blood pressure.

Rescue personnel asked Kopp basic information. They tried to check Kopp's blood sugar but he refused to cooperate. After Kopp's refusal to cooperate, it was deemed that there was no medical emergency where Kopp needed to be transported anywhere by ambulance.

When Kopp was ordered to sit back in the patrol car, he refused and went limp. We were holding him up, and trying to place him in the back of my car. I attempted to use the bent wrist technique to gain compliance. Kopp screamed but did not comply. Sgt. Siracuse and Ofc. T. Calvert attempted to place Kopp in the patrol car, but he refused

going limp, and tensing his legs at the same time. I cartridge off drive stunned Kopp again in the right thigh. He screamed but did not comply. He began screaming for help.

It was deemed that Kopp needed chemical restraints. Kopp was injected with Ketamine. He screamed from the needle being injected into his right shoulder, but quickly calmed down. He was placed on a stretcher and placed in an ambulance. Kopp was transported to lower Keys Medical Center for evaluation and clearance.

I transported Kopp to jail without incident.

Probable Cause:

810.01.3A-Burglary of an occupied dwelling. Scott Kopp entered the Anderson home, looking for guns and a woman named Michelle. While in the home Kopp knocked items off of shelves, and took a pair of Jack's shoes, throwing them out to the sidewalk from the second story, thus depriving Jack of his shoes.

812.014-2E-Petit theft. Jack's shoes are valued at between 100-300 dollars.

806.13.1B2-Criminal mischief-Kopp threw a chair and a mirror over the balcony, destroying both items. The items were provided by the Andersons. He threw the mirror over while I was standing there.

843.02-Resisting without violence-Kopp refused to put his legs in the car. He kept them stiff and pressed against the door. He also laid back in the seat, when we tried to sit him up. He went limp when we tried to place him back in the patrol car after medical examination.
