A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF KEY WEST, FLORIDA, APPROVING A CHANGE IN SCOPE TO CONTRACT FOR BID # ST 0902 TO CHARLEY TOPPINO FOR CONSTRUCTION OF STORMWATER GRAVITY WELLS PHASE V, INCORPORATING THE CONSTRUCTION OF EIGHT INLETS AND PIPING WITHIN THE UNITED STREET MILL AND PAVE PROJECT IN THE TOTAL AMOUNT OF \$100,671.03; AUTHORIZING THE USE OF PROJECT CONTINGENCY FUNDS; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE

WHEREAS, City staff has determined that it would be time-saving and cost effective to use project contingency funds to change the scope of the Stormwater Gravity Well Phase V project, which intersects with portions of the United Street Mill and Pave project, so that infrastructure of the George Street portion of the United Street Mill and Pave project can be constructed simultaneous to the United Street construction; and

WHEREAS, funding to cover the cost of the change in scope to the Stormwater Gravity Wells Phase V project is available from contingency funds already approved as a component of the original project by City Commission;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF KEY WEST, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: That the attached Change in Scope to the Stormwater Gravity Well Phase V Project (Bid # ST 0902) from Charley Toppino and Sons in the amount of \$100,671.03 for the

construction of eight inlets and piping to be incorporated within the United Street Mill and Pave Project is hereby approved.

Section 2: That funding in the total amount of \$100,671.03 is authorized from the project construction contingency fund.

Section 3: That this Resolution shall go into effect immediately upon its passage and adoption and authentication by the signature of the presiding officer and the Clerk of the Commission.
