CITY COMMISSION MEETING

TUESDAY, JULY 6, 2010

A regular meeting of the City Commission of the City of Key West, Florida was held in Commission Chambers, Old City Hall, on Tuesday, July 6, 2010.

Mayor Craig Cates called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

Answering roll call were Commissioners Barry Gibson, Teri Johnston, Clayton Lopez, Mark Rossi, Billy Wardlow, Jimmy Weekley and Mayor Craig Cates.

City Attorney Smith informed the Commission of the need to call for a Closed Session in the case of Keys WiFi v City of Key West prior to the July 20, 1010 meeting at 4:00 p.m.

Commissioner Johnston asked for a monthly update from the City Attorney regarding the Assisted Care Facility deadlines and the progress on those deadlines. The City Attorney would report his first update to the Commission via e-mail with the next update at the July 20, 2010 meeting.

(c) City Manager's Report -

City Manager Scholl reported that on July 14, 2010 the Navy will hold its annual Restoration Advisory Board Meeting, which is open to the public, regarding environmental cleanup of parcels the Navy has responsibility for, at the Double Tree Grand Key at 7:00 p.m.

On July 21, 2010 from 1:00 to 3:00 p.m. at Old City Hall there will be a public meeting on the North Roosevelt Boulevard Improvement Project which is scheduled to start in late 2011.

On the July 26 & July 27, 2010 here at Old City Hall there are two all day sessions scheduled for Budget Workshops for the next fiscal year's budget, starting at 8:00 a.m.

Mr. Scholl announced the City received an energy grant of \$750,000.00 that was coordinated with other municipalities in Monroe County. With the help of Sheila Griffin, our grant writer in Tallahassee, they received everything they asked for.

Mr. Scholl stated the official recognition for the Key West Police Department for reaccreditation due to the work from Chief Lee and his staff and was received last week.

Mr. Scholl reported that he and Russell Britton meet with Commissioners Lopez and Weekley (separately) on a more comprehensive proposal for any changes at the cemetery. He would meet with them again and were continuing to work on the gate issue.

Mr. Andrew Van Chow updated the Commission on the BP oil spill. He stated the TDC received a check for \$400,000.00 for advertising/promotion to encourage tourism here. He also stated there continued to be no threat of impact to the Florida Keys for the foreseeable future. The agencies involved are continuing to update and make enhancements to their plan.

Commissioner Wardlow requested an organizational chart before the budget review with perks for all employees.

It applies equally to members of advisory and non-advisory bodies who are presented with a voting conflict of interest under Section 112.3143, Florida Statutes.

Your responsibilities under the law when faced with voting on a measure in which you have a conflict of interest will vary greatly depending on whether you hold an elective or appointive position. For this reason, please pay close attention to the instructions on this form before completing the reverse side and filing the form.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPLIANCE WITH SECTION 112.3143, FLORIDA STATUTES

A person holding elective or appointive county, municipal, or other local public office MUST ABSTAIN from voting on a measure which inures to his or her special private gain or loss. Each elected or appointed local officer also is prohibited from knowingly voting on a measure which inures to the special gain or loss of a principal (other than a government agency) by whom he or she is retained (including the parent organization or subsidiary of a corporate principal by which he or she is retained); to the special private gain or loss of a relative; or to the special private gain or loss of a business associate. Commissioners of community redevelopment agencies under Sec. 163.356 or 163.357, F.S., and officers of independent special tax districts elected on a one-acre, one-vote basis are not prohibited from voting in that capacity.

For purposes of this law, a "relative" includes only the officer's father, mother, son, daughter, husband, wife, brother, sister, father-in-law, mother-in-law, son-in-law, and daughter-in-law. A "business associate" means any person or entity engaged in or carrying on a business enterprise with the officer as a partner, joint venturer, coowner of property, or corporate shareholder (where the shares of the corporation are not listed on any national or regional stock exchange).

ELECTED OFFICERS:

In addition to abstaining from voting in the situations described above, you must disclose the conflict:

PRIOR TO THE VOTE BEING TAKEN by publicly stating to the assembly the nature of your interest in the measure on which you are abstaining from voting; and

WITHIN 15 DAYS AFTER THE VOTE OCCURS by completing and filing this form with the person responsible for recording the minutes of the meeting, who should incorporate the form in the minutes.

APPOINTED OFFICERS:

Although you must abstain from voting in the situations described above, you otherwise may participate in these matters. However, you must disclose the nature of the conflict before making any attempt to influence the decision, whether orally or in writing and whether made by you or at your direction.

IF YOU INTEND TO MAKE ANY ATTEMPT TO INFLUENCE THE DECISION PRIOR TO THE MEETING AT WHICH THE VOTE WILL BE TAKEN:

• You must complete and file this form (before making any attempt to influence the decision) with the person responsible for recording the minutes of the meeting, who will incorporate the form in the minutes. (Continued on other side)

APPOINTED OFFICERS (continued)

- · A copy of the form must be provided immediately to the other members of the agency.
- · The form must be read publicly at the next meeting after the form is filed.

IF YOU MAKE NO ATTEMPT TO INFLUENCE THE DECISION EXCEPT BY DISCUSSION AT THE MEETING:

- · You must disclose orally the nature of your conflict in the measure before participating.
- You must complete the form and file it within 15 days after the vote occurs with the person responsible for recording the minutes of the
 meeting, who must incorporate the form in the minutes. A copy of the form must be provided immediately to the other members of the
 agency, and the form must be read publicly at the next meeting after the form is filed.
