Some of those items around which we structured this specialty team are:



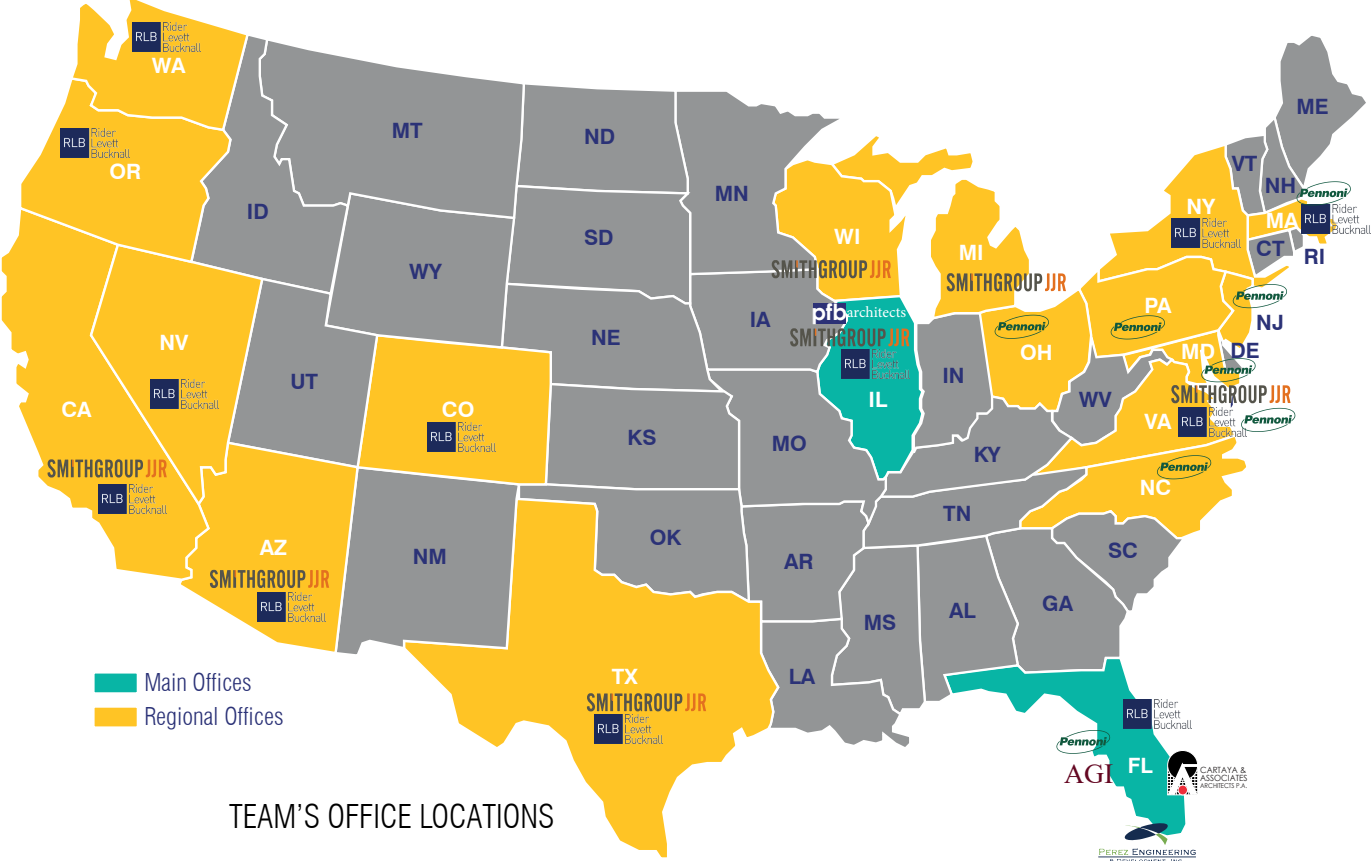
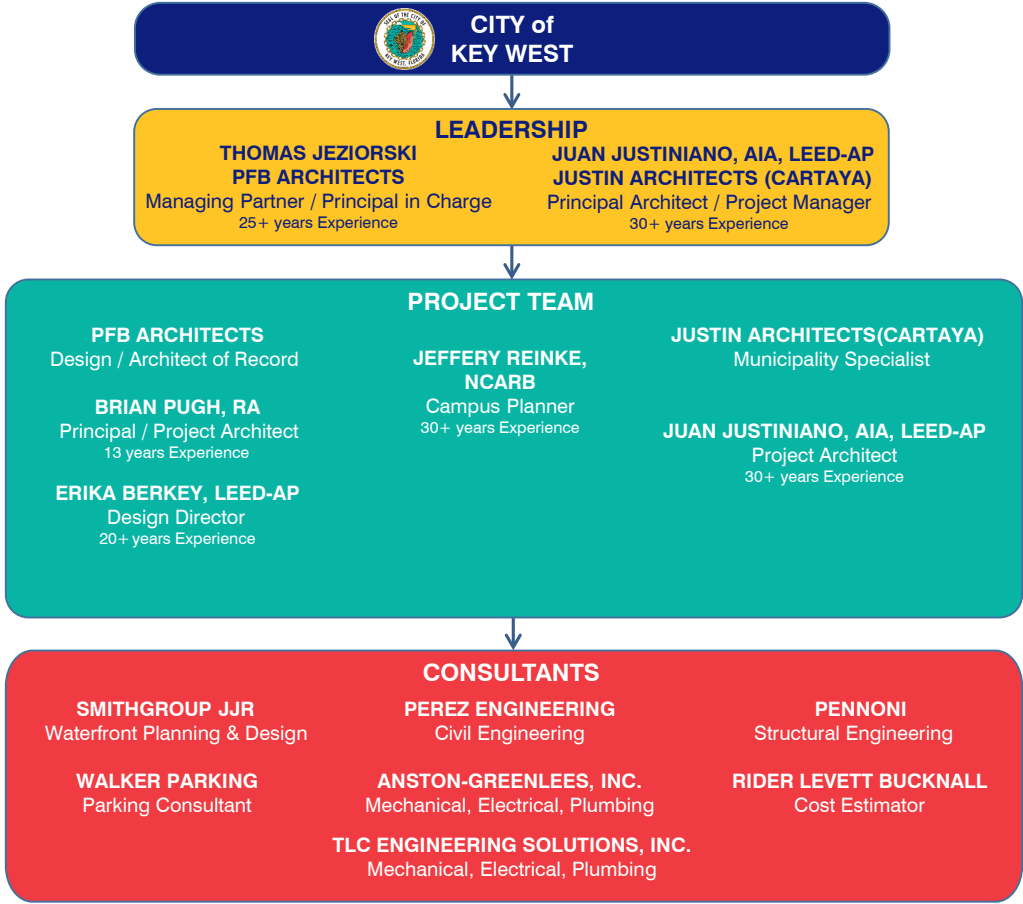


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Organization Chart

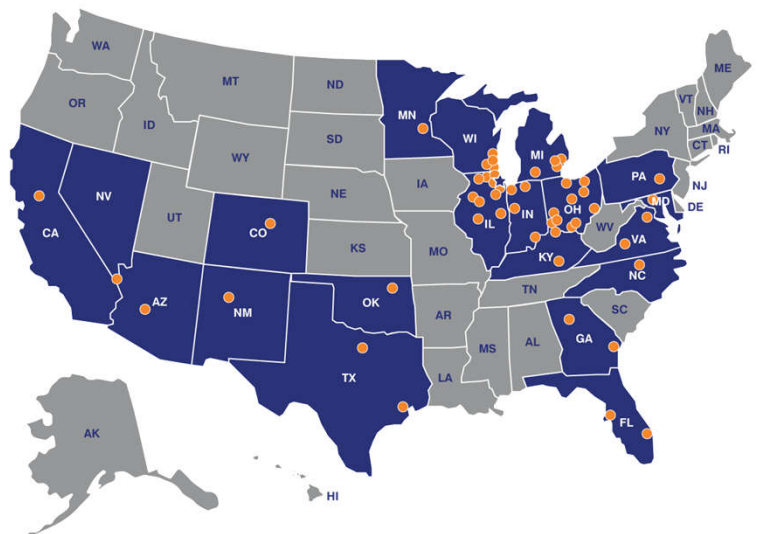

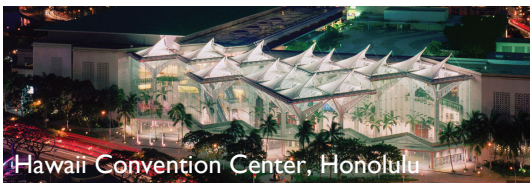

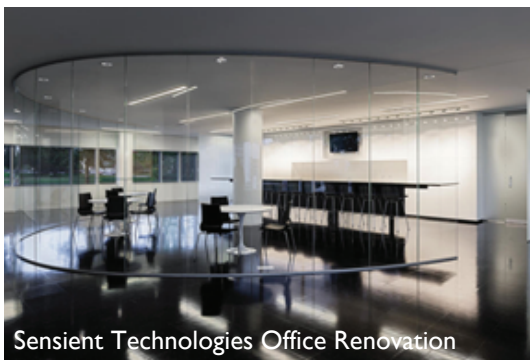

MANAGEMENT APPROACH

PARTNERING AND TEAMWORK

PERFORMANCE-BASED PLANNING

Measure, Measure, Measure – With any performance-based endeavor, the key is to measure, establish baselines, and continue to measure over time. Too often, the process stops after the design is complete and the end product remains static, bearing little to no information relative to performance, improved or otherwise. As a team of Users and Designers, a complete and thoughtful approach to Performance-Based Development does offer flexibility and the potential for continuous improvement. The following describes how Performance-based Planning concepts will be incorporated:



Baselines and Benchmarks – As mentioned earlier, the optimal place to start is to record or develop a baseline of your existing operation. For new service lines benchmarking is acceptable. Baselines and Benchmarking both provide a great deal of information from financial and operational performance, to institutional culture and patient experience, from which to best understand what your goals and objectives should be going forward. A post occupancy evaluation of the existing operation can identify what is working and what doesn't work. Once we understand this, and overlay this with our understanding of your culture, we can predict where improvements can be made and the likelihood of their successful implementation. The goals and objectives captured in this early assessment process inform the Guiding Principles for the project. These principles will be the criteria that all decisions will be measured against.

Programming – In programming it is important to understand that both the narrative and the functional programs are shaped to provide the most flexible, efficient and convenient operation. Administrative and User feedback is very valuable at this critical point in the process. This part of the process is where the greatest leverage toward efficiency and change can take place. This is also the time to challenge the "the way we always do it".

Financial Models – This is very important information in the sizing and development of the space program and ultimately the project. At a finer level, the Financial Models can inform the overall design of the unit which includes defining nursing ratios and other operational costs. Reimbursement rates can greatly affect your financial models so we would look to see how reimbursement rates are trending and provide you with a plan that remains flexible in this changing environment.



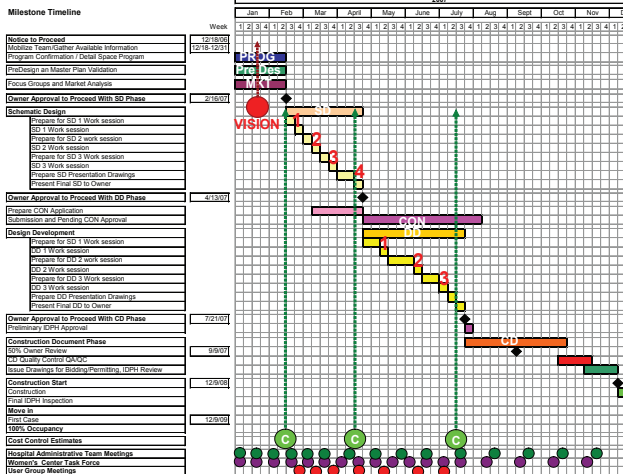
Project Budget – The project budget is a part of your financial model. We take budgeting and the adherence to the budget very seriously. We also understand that to best meet your project budget we should establish a parameter cost with the appropriate level of contingency for the project at the program level. Once we have established this initial budget, we review the developing design and budget concurrently and on a more routine cycle than just at milestone dates to catch any unintended scope or unanticipated cost increases. This avoids the big shock that can occur at milestone checks that a more traditional approach results in. We also strategically “layer” the design in a manner that allows adjusting the cost of a product or system in a manner that won’t adversely affect the function, overall look, quality, or impression of the project. It is true value engineering versus cost cutting. Our team brings a wealth of knowledge on cost control, both from the standpoint of national trends and local construction market costs. Members of the team are familiar with the level and format of information needed to submit for the Capital Approval to Spend process.

Project Schedule – Schedules are budgets of time and must be adhered to. Many of our projects have had a financial or operational needs that require “speed to market” or “speed to first user” or “occupy in phases,” so we are adept at establishing schedules and sticking to them. Sometimes we are asked to accelerate a schedule for a project that is underway. We are flexible, work well with our construction partners, and can adapt to your specific needs. It is also important to note that schedules should include timeframes for regulatory review, move-in, and activation.

Applicable local, state, and federal regulations and requirements – As a practice that works nationally, we are adept at navigating regulatory agencies and aligning the design of your project to meet the many requirements and guidelines governed by local, state, and federal agencies. Planning – The narrative and functional programs provide the descriptive outline and inventory of space to support the next step of planning and concept generation. 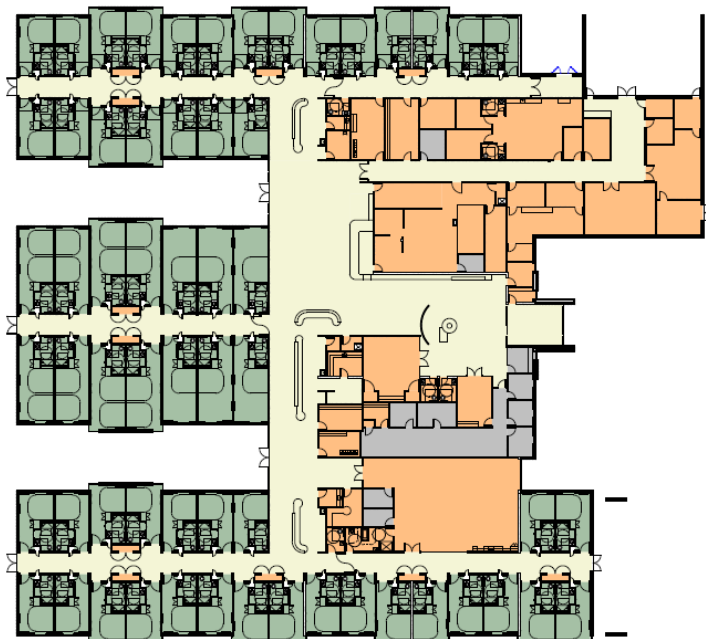

Project Description

The new Fire Station located directly on US-1 in Marathon Key, Florida. Hurricane Wilma had completely destroyed the old fire station and our Firm was commissioned to design a new 19,500 square-foot, two-level, fire station, and EOC facility as a fast-track project. The City wanted the project designed and built in twelve months, and so it was.

The facility includes an Emergency Operations Center, three apparatus bays, eleven private sleeping quarters, exercise room and a hazmat decontamination chamber. The structure is designed to withstand not only 200 mile per hour hurricane winds but also a 500-year flood event.

The Emergency Operations Center component consists of about 1,000 square-feet and is designed to serve as a Community Room, Conference Area, and Training Facility when not used for EOC tasks. The center is designed with a flexible and extensive communications system accessible from different room configurations (work areas, press areas, etc). This room allows for food preparation and includes a folding partition capable of providing an area for resting, or a component for privacy. The EOC room has its own dedicated electrical, telephone, communications, and HVAC system. The entire building is powered by an electrical generator.

The project was designed and constructed utilizing precast concrete panels. This methodology allowed the entire project to be constructed in one year from design to C.O. and came in approximately \$1 million under budget.

JOSEPHINE PARKER CITY HALL AT HISTORIC GLYNN R. ARCHER SCHOOL Key West, Florida

A historic 1920's building underwent an adaptive reuse from a two-story elementary school to the City of Key West's new City Hall. The 37,000 square foot facility has two structures connected by an outside walkway. The City is committed to sustainable building practices and set a challenging goal for the project of LEED Platinum certification, the highest designation awarded by the USGBC.

TLC was retained to help achieve this goal by providing energy modeling as well as LEED fundamental and enhanced commissioning services. TLC used IES Virtual Environment software to prepare energy models comparing the building's design energy usage with the ASHRAE Standard 90.1-2007 baseline building.

Building envelope, HVAC and lighting system options were analyzed to develop the most efficient building possible. Energy modeling helped the team make informed design decisions that are projected to improve the building's energy performance by 44% over the baseline. Among the implemented energy and water savings measures are roof surfaces with high SRI values to reduce the heat island effect, high-performance glazing to minimize heat gains and losses and cisterns to collect and reuse rainwater for irrigation.

Original design elements such as large historic windows were restored to allow sunlight to enter into the building and reduce the need for artificial lighting. A 70kW photovoltaic array / parking canopy is estimated to generate 25% of the building's annual energy consumption and can be easily expanded in the future.

TLC commissioned the mechanical, electrical, lighting, lighting control, plumbing and solar photovoltaic generation systems to verify that they operated as intended. Through sustainable design, energy modeling and commissioning, the Key West City Hall minimizes its carbon footprint and is on track to attaining LEED Platinum certification.

Sec. 2-773. Cone of Silence.

- (a) *Definitions.* For purposes of this section, reference to one gender shall include the other, use of the plural shall include the singular, and use of the singular shall include the plural. The following definitions apply unless the context in which the word or phrase is used requires a different definition:
- (1) *Competitive solicitation* means a formal process by the City of Key West relating to the acquisition of goods or services, which process is intended to provide an equal and open opportunity to qualified persons and entities to be selected to provide the goods or services. Competitive solicitation shall include request for proposals ("RFP"), request for qualifications ("RFQ"), request for letters of interest ("RFLI"), invitation to bid ("ITB") or any other advertised solicitation.
 - (2) *Cone of silence* means a period of time during which there is a prohibition on communication regarding a particular competitive solicitation.
 - (3) *Evaluation or selection committee* means a group of persons appointed or designated by the city to evaluate, rank, select, or make a recommendation regarding a vendor or the vendor's response to the competitive solicitation. A member of such a committee shall be deemed a city official for the purposes of subsection (c) below.
 - (4) *Vendor* means a person or entity that has entered into or that desires to enter into a contract with the City of Key West or that seeks an award from the city to provide goods, perform a service, render an opinion or advice, or make a recommendation related to a competitive solicitation for compensation or other consideration.
 - (5) *Vendor's representative* means an owner, individual, employee, partner, officer, or member of the board of directors of a vendor, or a ARCHITECT, lobbyist, or actual or potential subcontractor or sub-consultant who acts at the behest of a vendor in communicating regarding a competitive solicitation.
- (b) *Prohibited communications.* A cone of silence shall be in effect during the course of a competitive solicitation and prohibit:
- (1) Any communication regarding a particular competitive solicitation between a potential vendor or vendor's representative and the city's administrative staff including, but not limited to, the city manager and his or her staff;
 - (2) Any communication regarding a particular competitive solicitation between a potential vendor or vendor's representative and the mayor, city commissioners, or their respective staff;
 - (3) Any communication regarding a particular competitive solicitation between a potential vendor or vendor's representative and any member of a city evaluation and/or selection committee therefore; and
 - (4) Any communication regarding a particular competitive solicitation between the mayor, city commissioners, or their respective staff, and a member of a city evaluation and/or selection committee therefore.

- (c) *Permitted communications.* Notwithstanding the foregoing, nothing contained herein shall prohibit:
- (1) Communication between members of the public who are not vendors or a vendor's representative and any city employee, official or member of the city commission;
 - (2) Communications in writing at any time with any city employee, official or member of the city commission, unless specifically prohibited by the applicable competitive solicitation.
 - (A) However, any written communication must be filed with the city clerk.
Any city employee, official or member of the city commission receiving or making any written communication must immediately file it with the city clerk.
 - (B) The city clerk shall include all written communication as part of the agenda item when publishing information related to a particular competitive solicitation;
 - (3) Oral communications at duly noticed pre-bid conferences;
 - (4) Oral presentations before publicly noticed evaluation and/or selection committees;
 - (5) Contract discussions during any duly noticed public meeting;
 - (6) Public presentations made to the city commission or advisory body thereof during any duly noticed public meeting;
 - (7) Contract negotiations with city staff following the award of a competitive solicitation by the city commission; or
 - (8) Purchases exempt from the competitive process pursuant to section 2-797 of these Code of Ordinances;
- (d) *Procedure.*
- (1) The cone of silence shall be imposed upon each competitive solicitation at the time of public notice of such solicitation as provided by section 2-826 of this Code. Public notice of the cone of silence shall be included in the notice of the competitive solicitation. The city manager shall issue a written notice of the release of each competitive solicitation to the affected departments, with a copy thereof to each commission member, and shall include in any public solicitation for goods and services a statement disclosing the requirements of this ordinance.
 - (2) The cone of silence shall terminate at the time the city commission or other authorized body makes final award or gives final approval of a contract, rejects all bids or responses to the competitive solicitation or takes other action which ends the competitive solicitation.
 - (3) Any city employee, official or member of the city commission that is approached concerning a competitive solicitation while the cone of silence is in effect shall notify such individual of the prohibitions contained in this section. While the cone of silence is in effect, any city employee, official or member of the city commission who is the recipient of any oral communication by a potential vendor or vendor's representative in violation of this section shall create a written record of the event. The record shall indicate the date of such communication, the persons with whom such communication occurred, and a general summation of the communication.

(e) *Violations/penalties and procedures.*

- (1) A sworn complaint alleging a violation of this ordinance may be filed with the city attorney's office. In each such instance, an initial investigation shall be performed to determine the existence of a violation. If a violation is found to exist, the penalties and process shall be as provided in section 1-15 of this Code.
- (2) In addition to the penalties described herein and otherwise provided by law, a violation of this ordinance shall render the competitive solicitation void at the discretion of the city commission.
- (3) Any person who violates a provision of this section shall be prohibited from serving on a City of Key West advisory board, evaluation and/or selection committee.
- (4) In addition to any other penalty provided by law, violation of any provision of this ordinance by a City of Key West employee shall subject said employee to disciplinary action up to and including dismissal.
- (5) If a vendor is determined to have violated the provisions of this section on two more occasions it shall constitute evidence under City Code section 2-834 that the vendor is not properly qualified to carry out the obligations or to complete the work contemplated by any new competitive solicitation. The city's purchasing agent shall also commence any available debarment from city work proceeding that may be available upon a finding of two or more violations by a vendor of this section. (*Ord. No. 13-11, § 1, 6-18-2013*)

In the event that any action or proceeding is brought against the City of Key West by reason of such claim or demand, PROPOSER shall, upon written notice from the City of Key West, resist and defend such action or proceeding by counsel satisfactory to the City of Key West.

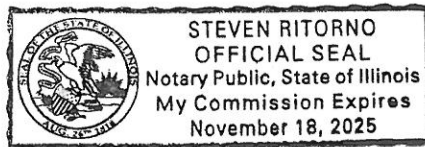
