A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF KEY WEST, FLORIDA, URGING THE FLORIDA LEGISLATURE TO REPEAL FLORIDA STATUTES SECTION 776.013, KNOWN AS THE "STAND YOUR GROUND" LAW; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE

WHEREAS, since the "Stand Your Ground" law was passed by the Florida Legislature in 2005, the statute has been considered as a defense in a number of controversial cases, including a recently prominent case involving the shooting death of Trayvon Martin by George Zimmerman in Sanford, FL; and

WHEREAS, the City Commission is concerned about the adverse social impact of the Stand Your Ground law, and a perceived racial bias that has been promulgated through its application in the court system; and

WHEREAS, the City Commission concurs with U.S. Attorney General Eric Holder, finding that stand-your-ground laws "...senselessly expand the concept of self-defense and sow dangerous conflict in our neighborhoods,";

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF KEY WEST, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: That the Key West City Commission strongly urges the Florida Legislature to repeal Florida Statute 776.013.

Section 2: That the City Clerk is hereby authorized to
transmit a certified copy of this Resolution to Representative
Raschein, Senator Bullard, members of the Florida House and Senate
leadership, Florida Attorney General Pam Bondi and Governor Rick
Scott.
Section 3: That the City Clerk is also authorized to
transmit a certified copy of this Resolution to U.S. Attorney
General Eric Holder, and to President Barack Obama.
Section $4$ : That the City Clerk is further authorized to
transmit a certified copy of this Resolution to the Monroe County
Board of County Commissioners, the City Commission of the City of
Key Colony Beach, the City Councils of the Cities of Marathon and
Layton, the Village Council of Islamorada, and the Florida League
of Cities.
Section 5: That this Resolution shall go into effect
immediately upon its passage and adoption and authentication by the
signature of the presiding officer and the Clerk of the Commission.
