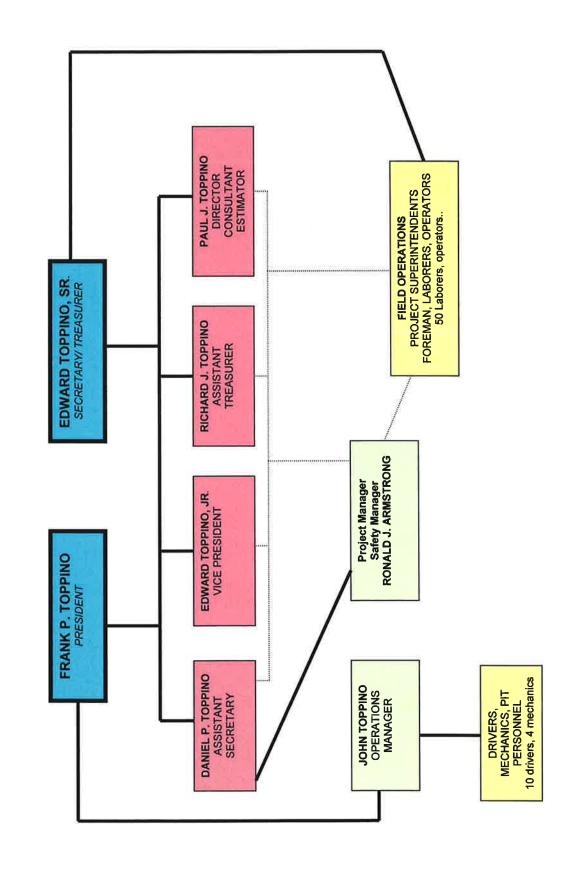

NATURE OF BUSINESS AND SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Nature of Business

Charley Toppino & Sons, Inc. and Subsidiaries and Affiliates (the "Company"), is a general contractor performing construction contracts principally in Key West and the Lower Florida Keys. The Company's two wholly-owned subsidiaries (Monroe Concrete Products, Inc. and Rockland Recycling Center, Inc.) manufacture and sell ready-mix concrete and concrete products, and lease adjacent real property to a commercial waste management company, respectively. Rockland Operations, LLC is a land holding company. 2537 North Highway 27, LLC leases real property to a commercial office product company. 2537 North Highway 27, LLC is wholly-owned by Rockland Operations, LLC. Charley & Sons, Ltd. is a first layer ownership entity with respect to Rockland Operations, LLC. CT & Sons, LLC is the general partner of Charley & Sons, Ltd. Toppino Industries, LLC is its limited partner.

Charley Toppino & Sons, Inc. is a wholly-owned subsidiary of Charley Toppino & Sons of Key West, LLC.

Significant Accounting Policies

Principles of Consolidation and Combination

The combined financial statements include the consolidated accounts of Charley Toppino & Sons, Inc. and its wholly-owned subsidiaries (subsidiaries include Monroe Concrete Products, Inc. and Rockland Recycling Center, Inc.) and certain affiliates.

The affiliates (affiliates include Charley & Sons, Ltd., Toppino Industries, LLC, CT & Sons, LLC, Rockland Operations, LLC and 2537 North Highway 27, LLC) of the Company are combined for financial reporting purposes based on their common ownership.

All significant balances and transactions between the entities have been eliminated in consolidation and combination.

Cash

The Company maintains its cash in bank deposit accounts, which at times may exceed federally insured limits. The Company has not experienced any losses in such accounts.

NOTE 1: NATURE OF BUSINESS AND SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)

Receivables

Contract and trade receivables are recorded at the original invoice amount less an estimate made for doubtful receivables based on a review of all outstanding amounts. The Company provides an allowance for contract and trade receivables it believes it may not collect in full. The amount of bad debt recorded each period and the resulting adequacy of the allowance at the end of each period are determined using a combination of the Company's historical loss experience, customer-by-customer analyses of the Company's contract and trade receivables each period and subjective assessments of the Company's bad debt exposure. Receivables are written off when deemed uncollectible. Recoveries of receivables previously written off are recorded as income when received.

A contract and trade receivable is considered to be past due if any portion of the receivable balance is outstanding more than 30 days.

In accordance with industry practice, contract receivables include retainages (holdbacks). Retainages are expected to be collected in less than one year and are therefore shown as current in the accompanying combined balance sheet.

Inventory

Inventory is valued at the lower of cost or market using the first-in, first-out method and consists of concrete and construction materials, equipment and vehicle parts, and fuel.

Property, Plant and Equipment

Property, plant and equipment is recorded at cost. Depreciation is provided for in amounts sufficient to relate the cost of depreciable assets to operations over their estimated useful lives on the straight-line method.

Long-Lived Assets

The Company periodically assesses whether there has been permanent impairment of its long-lived assets held and used (property, plant and equipment) in accordance with the guidance from Accounting for the Impairment or Disposal of Long-Lived Assets. The guidance requires the Company to review long-lived assets for impairment whenever events or changes in circumstances indicate that the carrying amount of an asset may not be recoverable. Recoverability of assets to be held and used is measured by comparison of the carrying amount of an asset to future net undiscounted cash flows expected to be generated from the use and eventual disposition of the asset. No impairment losses were recognized by the Company during the year ended December 31, 2012.

NOTE 1: NATURE OF BUSINESS AND SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)

Revenue and Cost Recognition

Revenue from fixed-price and modified fixed-price construction contracts is recognized on the percentage-of-completion method, measured by the percentage that incurred costs to date bear to estimated total costs for each contract. This method is used because management believes total incurred costs to be the best measure of progress on these contracts. Because of inherent uncertainties in estimating costs, it is reasonably possible that changes in estimates may occur in the near term. Revisions in cost and revenue estimates are reflected in the period in which the facts that require the revision become known. When the revised cost estimates indicate a loss on an individual uncompleted contract, the total estimated loss for the contract is provided for currently in its entirety without regard to the percentage of completion.

The asset, "Costs and Estimated Earnings in Excess of Billings on Uncompleted Contracts," represents revenues recognized in excess of amounts billed. The liability, "Billings in Excess of Costs and Estimated Earnings on Uncompleted Contracts," represents billings in excess of revenues recognized.

Contract costs include all direct labor and burden, materials and subcontractor costs and those indirect costs related to contract performance, such as indirect and prebid labor and burden, supplies, equipment operating costs including fuel, rental, shop, parts and repair costs, insurance and depreciation. Selling, general and administrative expenses are charged to operations as incurred. Changes in estimated job profitability resulting from job performance, job conditions, contract penalty provisions, claims, change orders, and settlements, are accounted for as a change in estimates in the current period.

Monroe Concrete Products, Inc. derives its revenue primarily from the production and delivery of readymix concrete and related products and materials. It recognizes sales when products are delivered at which time title passes and the earnings process is complete. Cost of goods sold consists primarily of product costs and plant operating expenses. Operating expenses consist primarily of wages, benefits and other expenses attributable to plant operations and delivery costs.

Rockland Recycling Center, Inc. derives its revenues solely from the lease of land and an industrial waste management facility. It recognizes rent revenue on a monthly basis, as the facilities are utilized.

2537 North Highway 27, LLC derives its revenues solely from the lease of land and a building and recognizes rental revenue on a monthly basis, as the facilities are utilized.

Revenues subject to sales tax are recorded net of taxes.

NOTE 1: NATURE OF BUSINESS AND SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)

Use of Estimates

Management uses estimates and assumptions in preparing these combined financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America. Those estimates and assumptions affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, the disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements, and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from these estimates and the differences could be material.

Income Taxes

The Company's stockholders have elected to file federal income tax returns as a U.S. Subchapter S Corporation. This election results in the allocation of the taxable income or loss to the stockholders. Therefore, these combined financial statements do not include any provision for corporate income taxes or refunds. The Company makes distributions to the stockholders during the year to assist in paying personal income tax liabilities resulting from the operations of the Company.

Three of the entities included in the combined financial statements are limited liability companies and one is a limited partnership. These entities' taxable income or loss is allocated to members and partners in accordance with their respective percentage of ownership. Therefore, no provision or liability for income taxes has been included in the combined financial statements.

Management evaluated the Company's tax positions and concluded that the Company had taken no uncertain tax positions that require adjustment to the combined financial statements to comply with the provisions of the Uncertainty in Income Taxes guidance. With few exceptions, the Company is no longer subject to income tax examinations by the U.S. federal, state or local tax authorities for years before 2009.

Advertising

Costs of advertising are expensed as incurred and are included as general and administrative expenses. These costs amounted to \$7,937 for the year ended December 31, 2012.

Subsequent Events

Management has evaluated subsequent events through April 2, 2013, which is the date the combined financial statements were available to be issued.

NOTE 2: CONCENTRATIONS

Credit Risk

The Company grants credit to customers substantially all of whom are local residents, businesses, utility cooperatives and municipalities. Consequently, the Company's ability to collect the amounts due from customers is affected by economic fluctuations in the construction industry particularly in the Lower Florida Keys.

Major Customers

During the year ended December 31, 2012, the Company recognized approximately 34% and 10% of its revenue from two customers. Revenue from these customers for the year ended December 31, 2012 was approximately \$5,148,000 and \$1,563,000, respectively. Contract and trade receivables from these customers as of December 31, 2012 were approximately \$748,000 and \$363,000.

NOTE 3: CERTIFICATES OF DEPOSIT

The Certificates of Deposit as of December 31, 2012 are deposited with two financial institutions in Key West, Florida at rates of interest varying from .18% - .40%, with terms varying from six months to one year, and which mature at various dates through 2013.

Charley Toppino & Sons, Inc. has a \$700,000 line of credit with a bank bearing interest at the higher of prime plus .75% (4.00% as of December 31, 2012) or 4.75%, collateralized by trade and contract receivables, secured by land owned by Rockland Operations, LLC, and guaranteed by the stockholders, related parties, and affiliates of Charley Toppino & Sons, Inc. The line of credit was renewed on February 3, 2013 and matures on July 5, 2013. As of December 31, 2012, there is an outstanding balance of \$479,261.

Monroe Concrete Products, Inc. has a \$500,000 line of credit with a bank bearing interest at the higher of prime plus .75% (4.00% as of December 31, 2012) or 4.75%, collateralized by trade and contract receivables, secured by land owned by Rockland Operations, LLC, and guaranteed by the stockholders, related parties, and affiliates of Monroe Concrete Products, Inc.. The line of credit was renewed on February 3, 2013 and matures on July 5, 2013. As of December 31, 2012, there is an outstanding balance of \$354,104.

NOTE 11: UNCONSOLIDATED VARIABLE INTEREST ENTITY

Charley Toppino and Sons, Inc. has a variable interest in Rockland Operations, LLC and subsidiary ("VIE") through common ownership; however, it does not have the power to direct the activities of the VIE that most significantly impact the VIE's economic performance and does not have the obligation to absorb losses or the right to receive benefits from the VIE that could potentially be significant to the VIE.

The real property that is collateral for the debt of the VIE has a carrying value of \$2,972,256. The VIE is financed through its own accounts payable and long-term borrowings. The assets of the VIE can only be used to settle the obligations of the VIE. The creditors of the VIE do not have recourse to the general credit of the Company.

No additional support beyond what was previously agreed to has been provided during the year ended December 31, 2012. The Company may provide additional financial support in the event the VIE needs it to support its operations, although not expected. As a result, the Company does not expect to have any loss exposure resulting from its involvement with the VIE.

NOTE 12: ASSIGNMENT OF RIGHTS AND PROPERTY UNDER INDEMNITY AGREEMENT

In order to procure a bonding line, the Company has assigned certain rights and property as collateral to secure its obligations under the indemnity agreement. These rights consist principally of rights under construction contracts, subcontracts, insurance policies and legal claims. The property assigned consists of all property and equipment, cash and accounts receivable.

NOTE 13: LEASING ACTIVITIES

The Company leases land, a recycling plant and a building to third parties under noncancelable leases with various terms through July 2021. The carrying value of the Company's investment in plant and building held for lease as of December 31, 2012 is as follows:

NOTE 14: COMMITMENTS AND CONTINGENCIES

The Company has guaranteed a note in the name of the Company's stockholders. The term of the guarantee is equal to the term of the debt. The remaining principal balance is approximately \$261,000 as of December 31, 2012. The note currently bears interest at 7.50%, matures June 27, 2018 and is collateralized by substantially all assets owned by the stockholders and the Company.

The Company can be required to perform on the above guarantee only in the event of nonpayment of the promissory note by the stockholders to the maximum potential amount of the remaining outstanding balance plus interest. Management evaluates the Company's exposure to loss at each balance sheet date and provides accruals for such as deemed necessary. No accruals were deemed necessary as of December 31, 2012. The Company has recourse only to the general credit of the related parties should the Company be required to perform under this guarantee.

The Company is involved in various legal actions arising in the ordinary course of business. In the opinion of management, the ultimate disposition of these matters will not have a material adverse affect on the Company's financial position or results of operations.

NOTE 15: RETIREMENT PLAN

The Company provides a defined contribution profit sharing plan ("the Plan") for its employees, whereby the Company may elect to contribute out of earnings and profits a percentage of the total compensation for the taxable year of all its eligible participants under the Plan. All employees of the Company who satisfy the participation requirements are eligible to participate in the Plan.

The Plan contribution range is subject to the limitations of Section 415 of the Internal Revenue Code. The amount of total Company contributions to be made is determined annually by the Board of Directors. During the year ended December 31, 2012, the Board of Directors authorized a profit sharing plan contribution totaling \$383,078, of which \$358,078 remained unpaid as of December 31, 2012, and is included in the accompanying combined balance sheet.

NOTE 16: ACCOUNTS PAYABLE

As of December 31, 2012, accounts payable includes amounts due to subcontractors totaling \$141,957, which has been retained pending completion and customer acceptance of jobs.

NOTE 17: INVESTMENT IN REAL ESTATE

On January 20, 2010, the Company entered into an agreement with two unrelated entities for the development of raw land located in Key West, Florida. The Company will be responsible for the construction of the necessary infrastructure for future residential development, which is estimated to be approximately \$4,200,000. The agreement stipulated that the work had to be completed within twenty four months. On December 19, 2012 the Company was granted an extension of time to January 20, 2014. The Company performs services on a credit basis and will be paid for services upon the sale of the developed parcels of land. As of December 31, 2012, the Company had incurred costs associated with this agreement in the amount of approximately \$85,400, which is included as other assets on the accompanying combined Balance Sheet.

NOTE 18: ECONOMIC LOSS PROCEEDS AND EXPENSES

During the year ended December 31, 2012 the Company filed two claims for economic losses incurred during the eight month period following the Deepwater Horizon Oil Spill in April 2010. The two claims were settled in 2012 for \$336,836 and the Company incurred expenses amounting to \$68,837. The net claim proceeds of \$267,999 are included on the income statement as Economic Loss Claim Proceeds, Net.

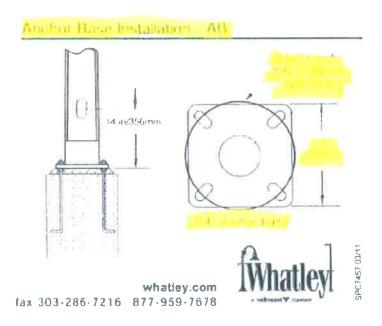
