**Original Narrative By Madilyn Flores, 12/05/25 02:24**

On 12/04/2025 at approximately 2314 hours, Ofc. Young, Ofc. Davis, and I (Ofc. Flores) responded to the corner of White Street and Angela Street. Key West Communications Channel One advised that the reporting party stated a male was punching the fence across the street with a female on the ground. Key West Communications Channel One advised that the male was wearing a blue button-down short-sleeve shirt and white shorts, while the female was wearing a blue and white striped long-sleeve shirt.

Upon arrival in the area, Ofc. Young was speaking with the male half. As I was getting out of my vehicle, I could see a female in a blue and white striped shirt and jean shorts running towards my vehicle. Based on the circumstances of a suspected domestic disturbance and the female matching the description, I announced myself as a Key West Police Department officer and advised her to stop. The female continued to run, as I continued to announce myself and tell her to stop. The female finally stopped in front of 716 Ashe Street, sitting on the curb. While attempting to speak with her about the incident, she continuously yelled and was causing a disturbance in the residential homes in the area. When the female was able to calm down, she stated that the male was her boyfriend and they had been together for approximately a year. After asking if I could get her identification from her purse, Ofc. Davis came to assist me.

As I was attempting to identify the female, she began to become verbally aggressive towards Ofc. Davis, yelling as she began to stand up. As she stood up, she began to back away before running on Ashe Street towards Petronia Street. The female turned onto Petronia Street, running towards Frances Street, turned onto Frances Street, before turning back onto Angela Street towards Catholic Lane. When I ran onto Angela Street, I could not see her running in front of me. As I went down Angela Street, I was able to locate the female hiding in a rear entrance to 1025 Angela Street.

When I told the female to turn around and place her hands behind her back, she lunged towards me with open hands. The female grabbed at my face, knocking off my glasses, and I felt one of her hands grab to front of my neck. I pushed the female off to get space before redirecting her towards the metal fence of the Key West cemetery. At this time, Ofc. Davis caught up and assisted in gaining control of the female. Once the female was on the ground, we gave her verbal commands to place her arms behind her back. When there was no change in behavior from the female, Ofc. Davis advised that he was going to utilize a drive-stun technique with a Key West Police Department-issued Axon Taser.

From Ofc. Davis' supplemental, he stated that he utilized the drive-stun technique once in the right, lower back area of the female. Once there was a behavior change was seen, there was control of the female's hands, they were placed behind her back in handcuffs, and the handcuffs were double-locked. At this point, additional officers arrived on scene, as well as the shift sergeant. A search was conducted of the female before placing her into the rear of a marked Key West Police Department patrol unit. During this time, based on the female's behavior, Key West Fire Rescue was contacted to conduct an evaluation.

At this time, the female was identified as Adela Umannova (DOB: 04/03/1990, Arrestee) with her Alabama identification card.

Based on Key West Fire Rescue Two's evaluation, Umannova was transported to Lower Keys Medical Center, reference run number KWFD202502992. I rode along in the ambulance to assist based on Umannova's erratic and unpredictable behavior.

Once Umannova was cleared from Lower Keys Medical Center, Ofc. Davis was able to transport her and myself to Monroe County Detention Center without further incident.

Based on the above facts and evidence, I find that on 12/04/2025, Adela Umannova did knowingly and intentionally violate F.S.S. 843.02 Resisting without Violence as she ran from uniformed Key West Police Department officers who announced themselves while speaking to her, conducting their legal duties during an investigation.

Based on the above facts and evidence, I find that on 12/04/2025, Adela Umannova did knowingly and intentionally violate F.S.S. 843.01(1), Resisting with Violence, as Umannova fought with me in an attempt to keep fleeing while dressed in my Key West Police Department issued uniform and badge, while conducting my legal duties and obstructing my investigation.

Based on the above facts and evidence, I find that on 12/04/2025, Adela Umannova did knowingly and intentionally violate F.S.S. 787.07(1)(e) Battery on Law Enforcement Officer, as Umannova did knowingly and intentionally strike and fight with me while dressed in my Key West Police Department issued uniform and badge, while conducting my

legal duties, and obstructing my investigation.

My Axon BWC was active for this incident. All videos were uploaded to Evidence.com.

At this time, no further information.

## **Supplemental Narrative By Sean Davis, 12/05/25 03:06**

On December 4, 2025, at approximately 2308 hours, I, Officer Davis, was dispatched to Peary Court regarding a suspicious incident possibly involving a domestic disturbance and criminal mischief. KWPD Communications advised that an anonymous reporting party observed a couple arguing in the area and witnessed the male punch and break a section of fence owned by the City of Key West. Communications further stated that the couple fled the scene on foot, traveling westbound down Angela Street.

Upon arrival, I conducted a canvas of the surrounding area for the subjects. After an extended search, Officer James Young located the male half at the intersection of Angela Street and White Street. I responded to that location and made contact with the male, later identified as Stuart Emory Brantley.

Brantley stated that his girlfriend of approximately one year, Adela Umannova, had been drinking heavily throughout the evening. He reported that he was attempting to return her to their hotel room when she became argumentative and repeatedly ran away from him. Brantley began explaining that Adela takes thyroid medication when Officer Flores radioed requesting assistance, as she had located Adela near Angela Street and Ashe Street.

I responded to Officer Flores' location and observed Adela Umannova seated on the curb. I identified myself and attempted to speak with her regarding the incident. Upon engaging with her, Adela immediately became irate, stood up, and began yelling. I issued multiple verbal commands for Adela to lower her voice due to the residential nature of the area. Adela refused to comply and continued escalating. I informed Adela that continued disorderly behavior would result in her being placed in handcuffs.

Adela then abruptly turned and fled southbound on Ashe Street. Officer Flores and I pursued her on foot, giving several lawful commands to stop. Adela continued running westbound on Petronia Street and then northbound on Frances Street. Officer Flores temporarily lost visual contact; however, while checking the area with her flashlight, she located Adela running westbound on Angela Street.

As I turned onto Angela Street, I observed Adela physically attacking Officer Flores, causing both to fall to the ground. I moved in to assist, and both Officer Flores and I attempted to gain control of Adela's hands to apply handcuffs. Adela actively resisted by tucking her arms beneath her body and refusing repeated lawful commands to stop resisting.

After several unsuccessful attempts to gain compliance, I drew my department-issued TASER and placed it on the lower right side of Adela's back, advising her she would be tased if she continued resisting. Adela continued to refuse commands, at which point I delivered a drive-stun application. The drive stun was effective; I secured control of her left arm while Officer Flores gained control of her right arm. Adela was placed in handcuffs and moved into the recovery position.

Shortly thereafter, Officer Christina and Sergeant Stutz arrived on scene. Officer Christina assisted in standing Adela up and escorting her to his patrol vehicle. Adela continued screaming and physically resisting, making placement into the vehicle difficult. She was ultimately secured, and Rescue was requested for medical evaluation following the TASER deployment.

Adela was transported to Lower Keys Medical Center for evaluation. While in the ER, Adela continued to be verbally abusive and uncooperative toward hospital staff. After being medically cleared, Officer Flores and I transported her to the Monroe County Detention Center for intake. Upon arrival, Adela again refused lawful commands to exit the patrol vehicle. After additional commands, she eventually complied and was turned over to MCSO staff without further incident.
