I think this is something the Tree Commission can discuss at our meeting Monday night. It might be a good item to include as part of the Heritage Tree program we are creating. I have attached a copy of the proposed program. I think having special tree awards or designations could easily be part of this program. I am hoping to start the application process in January with discussion and decisions made in the Summer/Fall. The discussions and final procedures are still being discussed but I hope to have a small group of volunteers that will review the applications and make recommendations to the Tree Commission for a vote. It will be important to have volunteers who are open minded and people I and the board can trust. Chuck Banks has been a leading supporter of this program and the first person I would ask to be a part of the review group.

I am also aware that the Merili McCoy Gardens at Truman Waterfront Park is in the process of being planted right now. I would check with engineering as to what kind of signage or plaque they might have for that area and if they are planting any sort of dedication. With that coming soon, a special tree award as part of the Heritage Tree program might work out perfect for initiating next year.
