





Recycling Update

A Recycling Coordinator is crucial for the creation and execution of educational initiatives and compliance monitoring programs.

Emphasis must be placed on proper recycling practices to minimize contamination. A composition study from May 2024 revealed that 21.9% of the City of Key West's recyclables were contaminated.

Communities with effective recycling programs reject loads containing 25% contamination. They evaluate pick-up routes and remove high contamination sources from collection.

Transparency with the community is essential to foster the development of strategies aimed at reducing contamination.

The assessment of recycling at City Hall identified areas where recycling habits could be improved. The Special Projects Coordinator has addressed these deficiencies by modifying procedures.
