

RESOLUTION NO. 14-105

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF KEY WEST, FLORIDA, AUTHORIZING FOR THE FY 2014-15 BUDGET YEAR AN EXPENDITURE NOT TO EXCEED \$500,000.00 FOR THE VIETNAM VETERAN'S MEMORIAL PROJECT, CONTINGENT UPON RECEIPT OF PRIVATE AND GRANT FUNDING; PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE

WHEREAS, in Resolution 14-068, the City Commission approved in concept a site plan, and providing financial support not to exceed \$150,000.00 for a Vietnam Veteran's Memorial Project; and

WHEREAS, an application for potential grant funding in the amount of \$250,000.00 from the Tourist Development Fund requires the applicant, the City of Key West, to show that that 100% of necessary funds for the project are available at the time of application; and

WHEREAS, the City Commission desires to demonstrate the commitment of City funds for this project, contingent upon the receipt of sufficient grant funding.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF KEY WEST, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: That an expenditure of up to \$500,000.00 for the Vietnam Veteran's Memorial Project is hereby authorized for the FY 2014-15 budget, provided that the City's financial contribution does not exceed \$150,000.00, and contingent upon

the award and receipt of additional funding in a sufficient amount to complete the project.


Section 2: That this Resolution shall go into effect immediately upon its passage and adoption and authentication by the signature of the Presiding Officer and the Clerk of the Commission.


